COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM



Round one of the Federation Council 2023-2024 Community Grants Program are now open, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organizations to apply for a share of the \$60,000 of funding pool for this year's first round of the Community Grants Program.

"The Community Grants Program is an initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"We see this as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a community focused initiative that gives Federation organisations a way of involving the wider community, their participation in local activities and championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact."

Eligible applicants can apply under one of

three categories:

- Category 1 – Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.
- Category 2 – Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
- Category 3 – Community events grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events, applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

Eligible applicants can apply for grant funding for one-off projects through one of the nine focus categories:

- Arts And Culture;
- Events & Tourism;
- Community Work and Welfare;
- Skill Development and Learning;
- Health Promotion;
- Accessibility and Inclusion;
- Young People;
- Senior Residence; and
- Children and Families.

"We have a great guide available to all residents and organisations, that can assist with ensuring your application and initiatives are eligible for funding available through our website," Mayor Bourke said.

The Community Grants Program will continue to operate in two funding rounds each year, for funds to be distributed in October and April. Applications for Round One close 5pm, Friday 15 September 2023. Applications recommended for approval will be considered and announced to successful groups at the October Ordinary Council meeting.

COUNCIL ADOPTS 'FUTURE FEDERATION' STRATEGIC PLANS



Council has adopted its 'Future Federation' Delivery Program, Operational Plan and Annual Budget as well as associated financial Plans at its June Council meeting.

Future Federation's combined Delivery Program, Operational Plan and Annual Budget is an important document that sets out Council's action plan for achieving the community priorities outlined in the Community Strategic Plan (CSP).

It identifies the specific projects, programs and activities that Council will conduct to progress community priorities, as well as initiatives required to fulfil Council's legislative responsibilities.

This is supported by the Annual Budget which outlines how Council will fund the delivery of services and projects to its community. It funds services like managing waste, maintaining infrastructure, community facilities and parks, operating libraries, events and services to people at all stages of life.

ELLA AND DAYNA TO LEAD THE FEDERATION YOUTH COUNCIL



Federation Council has welcomed six new Youth Councillors - Alyssa Walda (13), Bel Carroll (15), Dayna Carter (14), Ella Webb (15), Max Sampson (12) and Tiana Mack (15).

Ella Webb from Corowa was voted in as the Federation Youth Mayor, supported by Deputy Youth Mayor, Dayna Carter from Oaklands.

The group of new Councillors came together for the first time on Monday, July 31 at the Corowa Council Chamber and were sworn in as the 2023/2024 Federation Youth Councillors.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke congratulated the new Youth Council and said he was thrilled to see a diverse group of new leaders emerging.

"I congratulate these young leaders for stepping up and working to improve the liveability and future of their communities," he said.

"I look forward to working with the team to ensure the voices of young people continue to be heard in the decision making of the Federation Council."

Mayor Bourke said the Federation Youth Council has played an important voice for youth in our Council over the last five years.

"They have participated in Council advisory committees including the Corowa Skate Park and Corowa Aquatic Centre and provided valuable input into Council plans and strategies," he said.

"They have also been the lead on grassroot community projects such the Memorial Plaza Project, Community Piano, establishment of Corowa Soccer, Howlong Ping Pong Table Project, and By the Banks Mural in Mulwala and helped host youth focused events such as colour runs, skate park workshops, photography workshops, come and try days and outdoor movie nights."

The Federation Youth Council is an advisory committee of the Federation Council established in 2018. It represents young people aged between 12 and 25-years-old who live, learn, work or connect with the Federation Council Local Government Area. The Youth Council aims to provide a platform for young people to have a voice, provide feedback, advice and views on issues that are important to them and other young people in their community. Membership runs for 12 months and the Youth Councillors meet once a month during the school term via Google meet or in person.

FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT PROJECTS – FEDERATION VILLAGES



Federation Council has been successful in obtaining NSW State Government Floodplain Management grant funding to undertake four projects recommended by the 2022 Federation Villages Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan. These four projects include a Urana Levee Upgrade Design, Morundah Flood Mitigation Design, Federation Villages Flood Warning System and Boree Creek Voluntary House Raising and Voluntary Purchase Scoping Study.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said Council was very appreciative of the NSW State Government grant funding which will enable these four projects to proceed.

“Last year our Local Government Area was subject to extensive river and creek flooding from Corowa to Morundah,” he said.

“Flood mitigation works go a long way in protecting assets and the livelihoods of our residents and I for one am very pleased to see grant funding to support this much needed work to take place.”

All four projects have recently com-

menced. Residents are encouraged to view details of the four projects below:

- **Urana Levee Upgrade Design:** This project is being undertaken by consultants Dryside Engineering on behalf of Council. The project will produce detailed design drawings and documentation for the permanent levee upgrade at Urana. The design project is expected to take approximately 18 months. On-site investigation works are expected to commence in October 2023. Impacted landowners will be contacted directly in advance of these on-site investigations. At the completion of the project, Council will have a shovel ready project from which it can seek external funding assistance to construct the levee.
- **Morundah Flood Mitigation Design:** This project is also being undertaken by consultants Dryside Engineering for Council. The project will produce detailed design drawings and documentation for flood mitigation works at Morundah, including enlarged cross drainage culverts and a flow diversion bank for managing local runoff. The design project is expected to take approximately 18 months. On-site investigation works are expected to commence in October 2023. Impacted landowners will be contacted directly in advance of these on-site investigations. At the completion of the project, Council will have a shovel ready project from which it can seek external funding assistance to construct the works.
- **Federation Villages Flood Warning System Review:** This project will review existing flood warning system arrangements for the villages of Rand, Urana, Boree Creek and

Morundah. Improvement options for enhancing the flood warning system will be assessed. The project is expected to take approximately nine months. At the completion of the project, Council will be in a position to seek external funding assistance to implement the recommended flood warning system improvements.

- **Boree Creek Voluntary House Raising and Voluntary Purchase Scoping Study:** This project will assess which Boree Creek residential properties are eligible for inclusion in a voluntary house raising and voluntary purchase scheme. The scoping study project is expected to take approximately nine months. At the completion of the project, Council will be in a position to seek external funding assistance to implement the scheme.

FEDERATION VILLAGES - FLOOD WARNING SYSTEM REVIEW PROJECT – Community Meetings

Community information meetings are to be held at Rand, Urana, Morundah and Boree Creek in support of a new project initiated by Council, the Federation Villages Flood Warning System Review.

If you have an interest in flooding, wish to better inform yourself in regards to flood warning system arrangements, and / or you would like to pass on your opinions in relation to the existing flood warning system pros and cons, please come

along to your local session.

The project is being undertaken by consultant's Water Technology for Council. It follows Council obtaining NSW State Government funding to assist with the implementation of the Federation Villages Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan, which was finalized by Council in 2022.

The Flood Warning System Review project aims to identify actions which can lead to improved flood warning arrangements for the villages of Rand, Urana, Morundah and Boree Creek.

The community information meetings will provide further details on the project activities and also provide an opportunity for those present to describe their experiences, good and bad, in relation to flood warnings during past flood events.

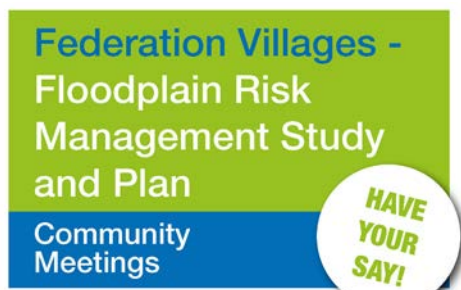
Meeting details are as follows:

- Tuesday 22 August - Rand meeting at the Recreation Reserve – starting at 3.00pm
- Tuesday 22 August - Urana meeting at Council's William Street office – starting at 5.00pm
- Wednesday 23 August - Morundah meeting at the Paradise Palladium Theatre – starting at 11.00am
- Wednesday 23 August – Boree Creek meeting at the Memorial Hall – starting at 3.00pm

Meetings are expected to take between 1 and 2 hours.

The above Boree Creek meeting will be followed by a second community information meeting for the Boree Creek Voluntary House Raising (VHR) and Voluntary Purchase (VP) project which has also recently commenced. Further details in regards to the Boree Creek VHR and VP project are provided in a separate article.

BOREE CREEK - VOLUNTARY HOUSE RAISING & VOLUNTARY PURCHASE SCOPING STUDY PROJECT – Community Meetings



A community information meeting is to be held at the Boree Creek Memorial Hall on Wednesday 23 August, commencing at 4.30pm. The meeting is expected to take between 1 and 2 hours.

The information meeting follows the recent commencement of a Voluntary House Raising (VHR) and Voluntary Purchase (VP) project for Boree Creek. The project is being undertaken by Federation Council. It follows Council obtaining NSW State Government funding to assist with the implementation of the Federation Villages Floodplain Risk Management Study and Plan, which was finalized by Council in 2022.

If you have an interest in flooding at Boree Creek, are the owner of a property at Boree Creek previously impacted by flooding, and would like to know more about the VHR and VP project, please come along to the community meeting.

Voluntary purchase (VP) involves the purchase of properties from willing sellers (at a fair and reasonable price) in high hazard flood areas, demolishing the houses on the purchased property and rezoning the land to ensure that no reoccupation of the vacated high flood hazard property occurs.

VP is typically considered where it is impractical or uneconomic to mitigate the high flood risk to properties as was found to be the case at Boree Creek.

The Scoping Study will:

- Assess which properties at Boree Creek are eligible for VP
- Consult with individual property owners to identify the level of interest in being part of a VP scheme
- Develop an implementation plan for the VP scheme

As part of the first stage of the Scoping Study, Council is undertaking a floor level elevation survey of all houses at Boree Creek. The floor level survey is expected to be undertaken during the week starting Monday 28 August, 2023.

Residents will receive a letter from Council regarding the floor level survey in advance of the survey.

Subsequent to the floor level survey and the eligibility assessment, Council will make contact with the individual owners of eligible properties to determine the owner's level of interest in taking part in the VHR or VP scheme.


Council stresses that the VHR and VP schemes are entirely voluntary. Residents are under no obligation to be involved in the schemes and may withdraw from the process at any stage.

Implementation of the VHR and VP scheme will only proceed if Council is

successful in accessing external funding assistance for the project.

Federation Council has recently initiated a project to prepare detailed designs for an upgrade of the existing flood protection levee bank at Urana township.

The detailed design of the levee is being undertaken by consultants Dryside Engineering for Council.

As part of the levee design project, Council is inviting Expressions of Interest from local landholders for potential borrow pit sites which contain material with a high clay content. Borrow pits found to contain suitable material could be used to source material for the levee construction.

An estimated 25,000 to 30,000 cubic metres of material will be required.

Once the Expressions of Interest has closed, a short list of the preferred borrow pit sites will be compiled.

Subsequent testing of the materials at each short listed site will then take place to determine the material suitability.

Testing will be conducted by geotechnical subconsultants engaged by Dryside Engineering who will require access to each short listed site. Testing of materials at the short listed sites is scheduled to take place in late October 2023.

ON EXHIBITION

At Council's July ordinary meeting it endorsed the draft Riverina & Murray Joint Organisation (RAMJO) and Riverina Eastern Regional Organisation of Councils (REROC) Model Contaminated Land Policy for public exhibition for a period of 28 days.

The draft policy outlines Council's commitment in regard to managing contaminated land in its local government area. It also provides information to internal and external stakeholders, interested parties and the broader

community on Council's position on managing contaminated land and is applicable to staff involved in Council land-use planning and development control functions, as well as in waste management in managing public and Council assets.

Council is inviting residents to review the draft policy from Council's website or at any Council office and provide any feedback by 5pm, Tuesday 29 August, 2023.

RATES NOTICES ISSUED

Federation Council would like to advise residents that the rate notice for the 2023-2024 financial year has been issued. The instalment one payment due date is Thursday 31 August, 2023.

Flexible payment options are available, including online payment via Council's website.

Included with your rates notice is information explaining the charges included on your rates notice and the Special Rate Variation projects and initiatives that the additional revenue will fund.

Council is conscious of the financial hardship that increased rates may cause and has recently updated its Debt Management and Hardship Policy.

INDEPENDENT PEER REVIEWED BUSINESS CASE STUDY OF FEDERATION COUNCIL

At an extraordinary meeting on Friday, July 14, 2023 Council resolved to appoint the Institute for Regional Futures (University of Newcastle) to undertake an independent peer reviewed business case study on the financial sustainability of Federation Council and the advantages and disadvantages of amalgamation.

Council adopted the following terms of reference at its July meeting:

1. A review and commentary of the validity of the former Corowa Shire Council's merger proposal submitted to the NSW State Government including all potential efficiencies and savings outlined in that report i.e \$40M over 20 years.
2. A review State Government's KPMG report on the Corowa and Urana merger proposal including (but not limited to) a review and commentary on whether the efficiencies and savings outlined in that study and were achieved, and if not why not.
3. A comparison of Council's financial performance since merger as opposed to the combined financial performance of the Corowa and Urana Councils prior to merger.
4. Analysis and provide commentary on the projected financial sustainability of the Federation Council from 2023 onwards including (but not limited to);

(a) The circumstances leading to the

current financial position of Council and

(b) an investigation of various options for improving the situation – these options will include additional sources of revenue and changes to expenditure profiles.

5. Whether, in accordance with section 263 (3) (e5) of the NSW Local Government Act, 1993 (the Act) there is a need (or desirability) to divide the Council area into Wards to ensure effective representation.
6. Any other matters of section 263 (3) of the Act considered relevant
7. Investigate options for engaging with NSW State Government to try to mitigate any issues identified.
8. After completing TOR 1 to 7 investigate the need, timing and conduct of a potential special rate variation application.

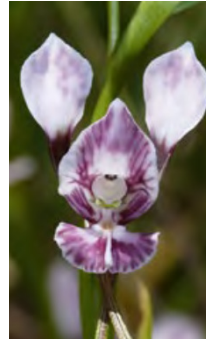

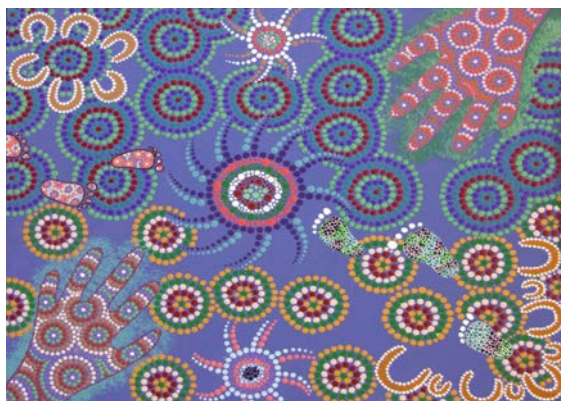

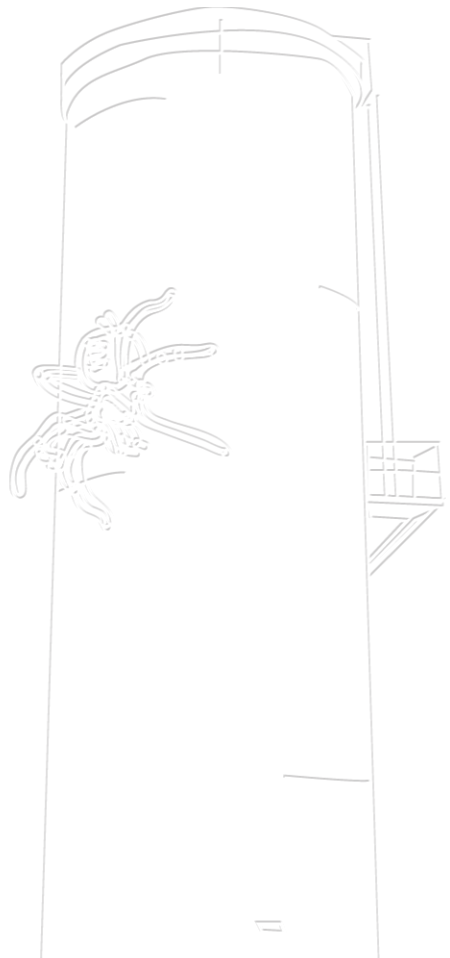

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.

Sunday 11:00am – 4:00pm

The facility is closed Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Years Day, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
