FISCHER COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP PROGRAM TO RUN 2-DAY IMMERSIVE WORKSHOP IN URANA

"To create a community of leaders

who believe that by taking action

they can make a difference."

The Fischer Community Leadership Program (FCLP) is returning to Federation Shire in 2024, with the program to be delivered twice over the year. The first delivery of the program will run as a new, two-day immersive workshop on Friday 21 and Saturday 22 March in Urana.

The program aims to enable and empower leadership within the community from the grassroots up. The focus is to develop leadership skills and create a group of community leaders that are equipped to take action and make a difference.

The immersive format will be hands-on, experiential, and focus on practical learning. Participants will be introduced to the skills, knowledge, and mindset needed for community leadership, as well as the requirements of a community project.

It is best suited to those who are:

- Interested in making a difference in their community.
- Current or emerging community leaders, including:

- Captains, coaches and other sporting leaders,
- -Local committee leaders
- -Emergency services volunteers
- -People wanting to make a difference in their community.

In addition to the two full day workshop, a further 4-hour session will be delivered in person, and 2 x 1 hour sessions will be delivered by Zoom, providing mentoring and guidance. Participants are also encouraged to come together for a local dinner after the first program day, to build relationships and strengthen their networks.

The program is delivered by Alpine Valleys Community Leadership in partnership with Federation and Greater Hume Councils, auspice by the Border Trust, and made possible by the grant funding from the New South Wales Government Stronger Country Communities Fund Round 5.

COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM SET TO OPEN



Round two of the Federation Council 2023/2024 Community Grants Program is set to open 5 February 2024 with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Council Mayor Pat Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organizations to apply for a share in \$30,000 of funding for this year's second round of Community Grants Program.

"The Community Grants Program is an initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"We see this as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a community focused initiative that gives Federation organisations a way of involving the wider community, their participation in local activities and, championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact."

Two rounds are facilitated each year, with a total amount of \$60,000 available to fund one-off projects through one of the eleven focus categories:

- Arts and Culture;
- Accessibility and Inclusion;
- Children and Families.
- Community Work and Welfare;
- Events & Tourism;
- Health Promotion;
- Seniors (Ageing Well);
- Sports and Recreation;
- Skill Development and Learning;
- Volunteers
- Young People.

Applications close Friday 15 March at 4 pm.

Applications recommended for approval will be considered and announced to successful groups at the April Ordinary Council meeting.

CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAM UPDATE - OCTOBER 2023

Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds and roads across the Federation Council Region.

The following activities were undertaken during October 2023 by Federation Council's Operations Works teams.

Balldale Road 8km reconstruction – LRCI Grant

Section 4km to 6km of bulk earthworks and widening, new gravel pavement second layer 100mm. Section 6km to 8km of bulk earthworks and widening, new gravel pavement first layer 100mm.

North Street, Mulwala - Kerb & Channel and footpath

Asphalting of the road surface in front of new kerb & gutter is completed.

Footpath Maintenance Program

Footpath repair program commenced, focusing on trip hazards and high pedestrian traffic areas.

RLRRP Grant – Shoulder Rehabilitation

Council secured funds from NSW Government for Regional Local Rural Road Repair Program to undertake road repairs on sealed and unsealed roads after the floods in late 2022. Council is using this grant to fund Shoulder Rehabilitation on various roads throughout the LGA. Roads commenced in October – Back Berrigan Road, Merton Road.

TfNSW – Ordered Works

Removal of 40mm of old asphalt and resurfacing of 3 roundabouts in Corowa. Federation Way, Sanger Street and Honour Avenue.

Corowa Landfill

A new hardstand area for concrete and bricks using recycled crushed concrete from the site has been constructed. Table drain maintenance Table drain maintenance focussed on customer requests during winter. Please Note: Works were carried out only in zones where no impact can be made on the Sloanes Froglet (between April and October breeding season).

Sealed Roads

Numerous customer requests for pothole repairs on sealed urban and rural roads have been received and actioned with the Corowa based Flocon patching truck and the Urana based Jet Master patching truck.

Work is continuous on all roads such as: Federation Way south/north, Jerilderie Road, Boree Road, Urana/Boree/ Morundah/Oakland and Rand township and rural roads.

- Gravel carting for resheet on Back Berrigan Road
- Gravel carting for resheet on Harbingers Road
- Gravel Carting to Kerrs Road

TfNSW - RMCC

Maintenance works under the RMCC agreement continued in October.

Quarries

Planning is well under way for the next phase of blast and crushing at the Balldale and Daysdale quarries. The gravels will be used for upcoming RLRRP and capital works programs. Awaiting contractor.

Slasher

Completed: Federation Way (towards Corowa), Corowa Oaklands Road, Back Berrigan Road Going onto: Oaklands, Boree Creek, Federation Way (towards Morundah), Morundah Township and surrounds.

Corowa Aerodrome

Twice weekly inspections carried out to ensure compliance with the MOS 139. Repairs to lights as required. Herbicide spraying on runway shoulders and around wind indicators. Slashing of grass runways to meet MOS 139 compliance, surrounds also slashed to suppress weeds and reduce fire risk.

Covid 19

No Outdoor Operations staff members were affected during October.



BE PREPARED THIS SUMMER



While summer is the time to get out and enjoy the warmer weather, it also comes with increased risk of fires, storms, floods and heatwaves. Whether we live in cities, suburbs or rural areas, now is the time to prepare so if these events do occur, we can respond quickly and efficiently.

It is important we understand the specific needs and risks for ourselves, our households and our community. It is also important to stay informed, take preventative measures where you can and plan the steps you need to take when an event occurs. This includes getting:

Fire ready. Make sure you prepare your home by trimming any overhanging trees or branches, mowing any overgrown lawn, and removing any leaves from gutters or around the house. Understand your specific needs and risks during a bushfire and have a plan in place should you need to evacuate. It is also important that you get familiar with the new Fire Danger Ratings to understand what actions to take when the danger of fire occurs in your area. Talk to your local RFS members about the likely risk of bush or grass fire in your local area this season.

- Storm fit. While storms can happen at any time of the year, October through to March bring an increased chance of strong winds and heavy rain. Now is the time to prepare your home for storms to help keep you, your family and the community safe. Check your roof and keep it in good condition, clean gutters, downpipes and drains to prevent blockages, trim trees and overhanging branches, and put away loose items that can blow around in strong winds.
- Flood smart. Increased risk of storms means an increased risk of floods. There are steps you can take to better prepare your home or business. Start by knowing your local risk and any evacuation plans in place. If you are in a high-risk area have your own emergency plan and emergency kit ready. It's important to consider road and bridge closures and make alterative arrangements for work, children and travel. Never travel through flood water.
- Heat aware. There is an increased risk of heatwaves this summer. Your everyday actions can make a difference to staying cool and healthy. Complete the heatwave preparation checklist to understand if you are more at risk or sensitive to heat and what steps to take during a heatwave. When hot temperatures do arrive, reduce the risk and prepare your home by shutting windows and blinds, using fans or air-conditioning and avoid using the stove or oven.

You can also help prepare through community volunteering, and by knowing your neighbours and those in the local area who may need an extra hand when times get tough. It is also important to understand the NSW Rural

Fire Service, State Emergency Service, NSW Health and Federation Council support that is available, and how and when to reach out for help. This includes supporting your mental health.

Together, we can prepare, protect and strengthen our community to face any challenges ahead. For more information visit nsw.gov.au/get-ready

NEW REQUIREMENTS FOR NSW FOOD BUSINESSES

NEW REQUIREMENTS for food businesses



Recent changes to the Food Standards Code have introduced new requirements for all businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW. From 8 December 2023. businesses that handle unpackaged food requiring temperature control, and serve it ready-to-eat, must have a gualified Food Safety Supervisor and ensure all food handlers are trained in food safety and hygiene.

Higher-risk enterprises must also be able to demonstrate their safe food handling practices. While some businesses already require a Food Safety Supervisor in NSW, the requirement is new for school canteens, childcare services, charities and not-for-profits, correctional centres, delis and supermarkets, and some coffee vendors.

With the weather heating up, Federation Council encourages residents and visitors to be aware and look after yourself, your family and pets by following these tips:

- Keep out of the heat, look for shade, wear a hat and try not to be outside during the hottest parts of the day (11am-4pm).
- Encourage people to look after themselves and keep an eye out for the young, elderly, neighbours and friends.
- Don't forget your pets and animals; ensure they have plenty of water and shade.
- Cool your home by closing the blinds in the morning before the sun gets hot.
- Never leave kids, adults or pets in hot cars, as the temperature can increase quickly.
- Council offices and libraries in Corowa, Howlong, Mulwala and Urana are air-conditioned and provide a cooler environment. Find opening hours and locations from Council's website.







URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
