HAVE YOUR SAY ON COUNCIL'S SPECIAL RATE VARIATION APPLICATION



Submissions have now opened for residents within the Federation Council Local Government Area to have their say on Council's Special Rate Variation application with the determining body the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART).

Federation Council is one of thirteen councils across NSW that have applied to (IPART) for a special variation to increase income from rates above the rate peg. The Special Rate Variation proposed for Federation Council is for four years from 2023/24 to 2026/27 at 19%, 17%, 14% and 10%, inclusive of any maximum rate peg amount set by IPART each year.

IPART will determine the application across the following criterions: a demonstrated need for higher increases to charges; community awareness of their plans; a reasonable impact on ratepayers; a process to exhibit relevant council documents to the public; and a history of well-documented council productivity improvements and cost containment strategies.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke said Council is not surprised that there have been numerous SRV applications lodged from other councils, applying for increases from 2023/24 onwards.

Mayor Bourke said Council is very aware of the cost-of-living pressures in the LGA and that was a huge factor in its decision to take a staged approach of applying for an SRV that if successful could be implemented over a four-year period.

"Council will also receive a report in the next few months, on pensioner subsidy options, to ensure we take into further consideration the impact our rate rise would have on our most financially vulnerable in our communities and to look at continued ways to best support these ratepayers," he said.

"It's an ongoing balance of addressing the significant and urgent asset needs such as roads and drainage, versus ensuring Council is considerate of broader economic factors affecting our ratepayers. I can assure people it is always front of mind for this Council."

NSW GOVERNMENT SUPPORT TO FLOOD IMPACTED COMMUNITIES



The Albury Electorate will benefit from the NSW Liberal and Nationals Government's plan to fast-track advanced payments of \$16 million in emergency funding in northern and southern regions for urgent work to restore access to flood-impacted areas.

Member for Albury Justin Clancy MP said the advanced funding would help Federation and Greater Hume Councils impacted by the devastating flood event in October and November 2022 as they recover.

"The NSW Liberal and Nationals Government is committed to ensuring measures are taken to prevent, prepare for, respond to and assist recovery from natural disasters," Mr Clancy said. "By putting emergency funding into the bank accounts faster councils can get on with the job of repairing and rebuilding damaged road and transport infrastructure sooner."

Federation Council Deputy Mayor, Cr Shaun Whitechurch thanked the NSW Government and Local Member, Justin Clancy following the funding announcement. "We have been working really closely with Justin through the flooding events across our LGA and I know he has been a big advocate for us when it comes to ensuring that we receive funding in a timely manner to enable our Council area to get on with recovering as quickly as possible," he said.

Minister for Regional Transport and Roads Sam Farraway said the cash is being directed straight to councils which, with their detailed knowledge of their local region and roads, are best placed to identify those critical priority areas.

"This new support is on top of more than \$60 million in emergency funding already provided to councils devastated by severe weather across the Central West and North Coast last year," Mr Farraway said.

"It's evident more now than ever that we need to build our infrastructure back to be more resilient against mother nature, which is why the NSW Liberal and Nationals Government pushed for the \$312.5 million Betterment Program for councils in the Northern Rivers.

"This new, first of its kind, natural disaster funding program allows councils to build back their road and transport infrastructure to withstand extreme weather events, it's the way of the future and will help our great state to come back stronger after a natural disaster."

Mr Harry Couzin is truly a community spirited man and the members of the Urana Local Heath Advisory Committee and Community Health would like to take this opportunity to say THANK YOU HARRY, for your amazing positive contribution to so many people's lives within the Urana district.







URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.
