FEDERATION COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM



Round two of the Federation Council 2023/2024 Community Grants Program is now open with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organizations to apply for a share in \$30,000 of funding for this year's second round of Community Grants Program.

"The Community Grants Program is an initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council."

"We see this as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a community focused initiative that gives organisations a way of involving the wider community, their participation in local activities and, championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact," Mayor Bourke said.

Eligible applicants can apply under one of three categories:

- Category 1 Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.
- Category 2 Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
- Category 3 Community events grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events, applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

Eligible applicants can apply for grant funding for one-off projects through one of the eleven focus categories:

- 1. Arts and Culture:
- 2. Accessibility and Inclusion;
- 3. Children and Families.
- 4. Community Work and Welfare;
- 5. Events & Tourism:
- 6. Health Promotion:
- 7. Seniors (Ageing Well);
- 8. Sports and Recreation:
- 9. Skill Development and Learning;
- 10. Volunteers
- 11. Young People

"If you are an eligible group and you have a great idea that can benefit the wider community, submit your initiative through the Community Grants Program via our online application form from Monday 5 February, 2024. Applications will close 5pm, Friday 15 March 2024."

Council encourages all groups wishing to apply to check Council's website for the guidelines to ensure Council can assist as many groups as possible bring new ideas to fruition for the region.

Applications recommended for approval will be considered and announced to successful groups at the April 2024 Ordinary Council meeting.

COUNCIL CELEBRATES AUSTRALIA DAY IN MORUNDAH

The Federation community were joined by Australia Day Ambassador Anupam Sharma and Council officials to celebrate Australia Day at the Paradise Palladium Theatre in Morundah, where community members were treated to Dylan Forge's fantastic rendition of our Australian Anthem. The ceremony was followed by a free community lunch catered by the Morundah Bush Entertainment Committee Inc. and musical entertainment from the Moodemere String Quartet.

2024 AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS

Citizen of the Year Winner: Leo Anic. Leo Anic has been pivotal in the establishment of two initiatives, Friday Night @The Station and The Men's Table. He has also provided emergency and crisis support through his work as the first Amaranth Ambassador. Leo exemplifies community pride through promoting local businesses. Leo and his camera can always be found at community events,

recording them for posterity and posting them on various social media platforms to showcase the wonderful community we live in.

Earlier this year Leo travelled to Snowy Valleys bushfire recovery area with Amaranth Foundation to film the efforts of a Corowa NFP working in bushfire recovery remotely. Leo's video resulted in Amaranth Foundation being nominated for the MPHN 2023 Primary Healthcare Awards under the 'Promoting Healthy Communities' category. Leo recently took on the role of Town Crier as part of festive season celebrations.

Young Citizen of the Year Winner: Dylan Forge.

Performer Dylan Forge was the Inaugural Federation Council Youth Mayor which led him to oversee several community projects including the Memorial Plaza Interactive Mural, Colour Run, Howlong Lowe's Square ping pong table and the Sanger Street Piano.

Dylan has represented our region overseas in Scotland, Ireland, Malaysia and Singapore with Bagpipe playing. Dylan was successful in 2023 in becoming a world champion bagpipe player with his former school, The Scots School Albury Pipe Band. They were the aggregate winner of the competition in Grade 4B, receiving the title "Championof Champions". Dylan was a bagpiper in The Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo this year, which involved him playing 25 shows in front of 9,000 people each night.

Other committees and groups Dylan has been involved in include the Skate Park Advisory Committee, Corowa Pool Advisory Committee, Corowa Leos and St. Mary's Corowa Altar Servers.

Community Group of the Year Joint Winners: Howlong Community Progress Association Inc and Country Women's Association of NSW Oaklands Branch.

The Howlong Community Progress Association Inc (HCPA) has been in existence for three and half years. All projects undertaken are for the benefit of the Howlong community.

The development of a Community Emergency Response Team instigated by the HCPA was a significant development for the community. A number of volunteers rostered on 24/7, addressing the need for quick response to health emergencies. This response time has now been significantly reduced from over 25 minutes to under 10 minutes.

HCPA has a volunteer committee which meets monthly to deliver a wide range of outcomes. The HCPA has undertaken the following activities: Annual Cleanup Australia Day, functions with a BBQ, have been guest speakers at public meetings which have included Greg Page the founder of Heart of the Nation. Their short-term goals are to assist with the Christmas Festival, light up the Main Street for Christmas and fundraising to build a toilet facility at the Howlong Cemetery.

The Oaklands branch of the CWA was formed in 1949. They currently have ten members who help in all community events and projects, catering events at their rooms, hosting the Women's Dinner and working with Oaklands Central School.

One of their key initiatives has been the preservation and protection of the endangered Oaklands Diuris orchid. In 2012 they instigated the building and erection of a steel sculpture in the gardens of the CWA Rooms in the town centre to highlight the endangered species. Over many months, assisted by

the 'save and protect' team, many tasks towards the preservation of the orchid were achieved. Many hours of work went into updating information on signage to promote the orchid, providing the latest progress in planting thousands of orchids in the Southern Riverina.

On the 12th October 2023, the Oaklands Branch's efforts were rewarded in NSW Parliament by the Legislative Assembly Hansard. They were thanked for their dedication and efforts to the save the Oaklands Diuris orchid.

FLOOD MITIGATION DESIGN PROJECTS AT URANA AND MORUNDAH

Federation Council commenced two flood mitigation design projects in June 2023. The projects are being undertaken by consultant's Dryside Engineering for Federation Council. The projects have now progressed to the completion of the concept design stage. The concept design drawings can be viewed and / or downloaded from this page.

The first project at Urana involves the design of an upgrade of the existing temporary 1.2 km long flood protection levee. The 2.2 km long upgraded levee at Urana will be predominantly located on unused road reserve. The levee will be constructed from a suitable clay based material, topsoiled and grassed.

The Urana levee design crest height will most likely be elevated 0.5 metre above the 1 in 100 year flood level, providing the township with protection from Urangeline and Billabong Creek flooding. Culvert structures will be provided through the levee to cater for local runoff flooding, with provision to prevent backflows from the wet side of the levee.

The second design project at Morundah includes a 660 metres long diversion bund / levee designed to protect the township from local runoff flooding originating from the east side of the town area. The bund will be approximately 0.6 metre high. The bund will deflect local runoff away from the town area.

The Morundah works will also include an upgrade of the gravity pipe drain through the existing creek levee bank adjacent to the stormwater pump outlet facility.

The proposed 1.35 metres diameter culvert will provide for extra capacity to discharge local runoff flooding.

The design projects will now progress to detailed design over the next six to nine months. The detailed design drawings will be put out for public comment prior to finalization.

Once the design project are completed, Council will apply in early 2025 for NSW and / or Federal Government funding to construct the flood mitigation works. If Council is successful in accessing funding, the construction works would be expected to take place in 2026.

AGEING WELL COMMITTEE - NO BROKEN HEARTS THIS VALENTINE'S DAY

To ensure there is no heartbreak this Valentine's Day, the Federation Ageing Well Committee is doing their bit by raising awareness about the importance of knowing CPR and being familiar with the nearest Automated External Defibrillator (AED), in case you need it in the event of an emergency.

Around 25,000 Australians suffer a cardiac arrest outside of hospital every year. The quicker a person in cardiac arrest receives CPR and defibrillation (if possible), not only improves their chances of survival but it can also help to improve the chances of them recovering fully and reduces the time to do so. Using a defib in the minutes before an ambulance arrives can double someone's chances of survival. In fact, research has shown that early cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and defibrillation in the first eight to ten minutes sees survival rates jump from 6% up to 75%.

Ageing Well Committee member, Yvonne Perrin wants people to know that the growing health issue of sudden cardiac arrest has a response we can all participate in, "You can play your part in making our community a safer place for everyone by completing a first aid course and having the skills and confidence to respond effectively with CPR, and knowing where the nearest defibrillator is located."

A defibrillator (sometimes called a 'defib', or AED if it's an automated external defibrillator) can save someone's life if they have a cardiac arrest. They are easy to use and take up no more room than a fire extinguisher. Those shocked by a public defibrillator had an impressive 47% survival rate, far higher than the 26% survival for those who were shocked first by paramedics.

"In the last few years, we have seen a number of public accessible defibs be installed across the Council area that are available 24 /7. There is now one outside the Hume Bank in Corowa and Howlong, Club Corowa, Oaklands RSL & Bowling Club, Balldale Hotel, and the Howlong Football Netball Club. Along with many local sports and community groups having defibrillators available in the club rooms," said Yvonne. "Knowing that there is AEDs that any community member can access at any time is comforting for many older people, especially those that live in our rural towns and villages where emergency services may take up to 45 minutes to arrive due to the distance."

The Ageing Well Committee have recently been discussing at their meetings AED Locator apps such as the Heart of the Nation app. "One of the committee members mentioned Heart of the Nation, created by the original yellow Wiggle, Greg Page OAM, which has an app that you can download onto your phone, "said Ageing Well Ageing Well Committee member, Wendy Eyers.

"If you are willing and able to perform CPR, and are aged 18 or older, you can also register yourself as a community responder such as Good SAM to via the NSW Ambulance. It can call 000 for you, alert nearby responders when a cardiac arrest is happening so they can help with CPR, and deliver an AED and provides a map of devices nearby."

Wendy is also encouraging community groups, businesses and organisations with publicly accessible defibrillators to ensure their defibrillator is registered on the NSW Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Register, "Spending a few minutes and registering your defibrillator could make a real difference in saving someone's life giving the responder real time access to AED locations and their availability,"

NSW The Automated External NSW Defibrillator (AED) Register Government imitative which will assist first responders in providing first aid. while also allowing communities, town planners and researchers to understand the availability of AEDs across NSW and look at opportunities to install new ones. As a person responsible for one or more AEDs, you can register your AEDs through your Service NSW account, following the prompts to 'Register my AED' or by going directly to register.aed. nsw.gov.au.

Fight the Bite!

Mosquitoes are going to be out in force this summer.

Mosquitoes can give people serious diseases like Ross River Virus, Barmah Forest Virus and Murray Valley Encephalitis. Follow these 4 simple steps to protect your family from mosquito bites.



- 1 Try and avoid areas where mosquitoes are common, like swamps and marshlands.
- 2 Wear loose, long and light coloured clothing, especially around dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active.
- Wear mosquito repellent. Use brands that contain either DEET, Picaridin or oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE), apply to all uncovered skin and follow the label directions.
- 4 Get rid of mosquitoes around the house by using plug-in insecticide mats, flying insect knock-down sprays and fly screens. Remove any water-holding containers outside the house where mosquitoes could breed.

HAVE YOUR SAY - HELP SHAPE THE FUTURE OF COROWA HEALTH SERVICE

Residents of Corowa and surrounding towns are invited to have their say on the future planning of health services for the community.

A community survey will be launched on Thursday, 1 February as part of the service planning process that will see the development of the Corowa Health Service Plan.

Murrumbidgee Local Health District (MLHD) Chief Executive, Jill Ludford said consultation with stakeholder groups and community members is an important part of developing a Health Service Plan.

"A Health Service Plan outlines the health services required to reflect the community's needs into the future and makes recommendations about the best way to deliver these services," Ms Ludford said.

"Communities play a critical role in the process of developing a Health Services Plan and we will be providing a range of opportunities for people to be involved, including surveys, street stalls, and meetings with key stakeholders and community members."

A Partnership Reference Committee has been convened to provide local input throughout the planning process. This group involves various stakeholders including members of the Local Health Advisory Committee, Federation Council, community representatives and local service providers such as GP's, NSW Ambulance, and the Primary Health Network.

The project team will also engage with a broad range of healthcare stakeholders including Corowa Health Service staff, social and aged care service providers, medical centres, and other health organisations.

A number of street stalls will also occur during February and March to gather input from the community. Look out for our 'Have Your Say' banner in the main street.

"We want as many people as possible within the local community to get involved, including young people and people from Aboriginal and other culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds, so we capture a variety of views and needs within the local area.

"Wide input is essential to develop a plan fit for the future."

Following the consultation process a draft Health Service Plan will be produced and placed on public display for one month for stakeholders to provide feedback. The feedback will be assessed, consolidated and incorporated into the final plan where feasible, and discussed with the Partnership Reference Committee prior to endorsement through MLHD.

HOW TO HAVE YOUR SAY

To complete the Community Survey and find out when street stalls will be held go to the Murrumbidgee Local Health District website

The survey is open for four weeks – 1 February to 29 February 2024.

Paper copies of the survey will also be available at Corowa Hospital reception, HealthOne reception, and Federation Council's Corowa Customer Service Centre and can be returned to these locations by 29 February.

CAPITAL WORKS PROGRAM UPDATE - NOVEMBER 2023



Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds and roads across the Federation Council Region. The following activities were undertaken during November 2023 by Federation Council's Operations Works teams.

Boree Creek Road 900-meter reconstruction

Section from 6km to 8km, new gravel pavement, second layer 100mm. Final trim of and sealing of 2km to 8km section.

Balldale Road 8km reconstruction – LRCI Grant

Lime stabilization has been completed for the 900m section of the works. Gravel works commenced however were delayed due to wet weather. Once gravel is placed and compacted, sealing works can be completed.

Shoulder Rehabilitation Back Berrigan Road

Shoulder rehabilitation work on Back Berrigan Road was completed. The works included rehabilitation of a 1m wide strip with a 400m seal.

Footpath Maintenance Program

Footpath repair program commenced, focusing on trip hazards and high

pedestrian traffic areas.

RLRRP Grant – Shoulder Rehabilitation

Council secured funds from NSW Government for Regional Local Rural Road Repair. Program to undertake road repairs on sealed and unsealed roads after the floods in late 2022. Council is using this grant to fund Shoulder Rehabilitation on various roads throughout the LGA.

Works ongoing in November – Back Berrigan Road, Merton Road.

TfNSW - Ordered Works

Line marking of 3 roundabouts Federation Avenue, Sanger Street and Honour Avenue after asphalt resurfacing.

Corowa Landfill

A new hardstand area for concrete and bricks using recycled crushed concrete from the site has been constructed.

Table drain maintenance

Table drain maintenance focussed on customer requests during winter. Please Note: Works were carried out only in zones where no impact can be made on the Sloanes Froglet (between April and October breeding season).

Sealed Roads

Line marking of intersection hold lines, loading zones, disabled carparks in Corowa. Line marking Howlong Medical Centre carpark. Numerous customer requests for pothole repairs on sealed urban and rural roads have been received and actioned with the Corowa based Flocon patching truck and the Urana based Jet Master patching truck.

Work is continuous on all roads such as: Federation Way south/north, Jerilderie Road, Boree Road, Urana/Boree/Morundah/Oakland and Rand township and rural roads.

URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.

The facility is closed Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Years Day, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
