COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM



Round one of the Federation Council 2023-2024 Community Grants Program will open on Monday 7 August 2023, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organizations to apply for a share of the \$60,000 of funding pool for this year's first round of the Community Grants Program.

"The Community Grants Program is an initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"We see this as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a community focused initiative that gives Federation organisations a way of involving the wider community, their participation in local activities and championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact."

Eligible applicants can apply under one of

three categories:

- Category 1 Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.
- Category 2 Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
- Category 3 Community events grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events, applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

Eligible applicants can apply for grant funding for one-off projects through one of the nine focus categories:

- Arts And Culture;
- Events & Tourism:
- Community Work and Welfare;
- Skill Development and Learning;
- Health Promotion;
- Accessibility and Inclusion;
- Young People;
- Senior Residence: and
- Children and Families.

"We have a great guide available to all residents and organisations, that can assist with ensuring your application and initiatives are eligible for funding available through our website," Mayor Bourke said.

The Community Grants Program will continue to operate in two funding rounds each year, for funds to be distributed in October and April. Applications for Round One close 5pm, Friday 15 September 2023. Applications recommended for approval will be considered and announced to successful groups at the October Ordinary Council meeting.

COUNCIL ADOPTS 'FUTURE FEDERATION' STRATEGIC PLANS



Council has adopted its 'Future Federation' Delivery Program for 2023/24 at its June Council meeting.

The Delivery Program, incorporating the Operational Plan and Annual Budget, is an important document that sets out Council's action plan for achieving the community priorities outlined in the Community Strategic Plan (CSP).

It identifies the specific projects, programs and activities that Council will conduct to progress community priorities, as well as initiatives required to fulfil Council's legislative responsibilities. This is supported by the Annual Budget which outlines how Council will fund the delivery of services and projects to its community. It funds services like managing waste, maintaining infrastructure, community facilities and parks, operating libraries, events and services to people at all stages of life.

The adopted plans will be made available from Council's website.

PLANNING REGULATIONS CHANGE

Federation Council wishes to advise that planning regulations have recently changed in regards to who can apply for a post consent certificate;

- Construction Certificate
- Final Occupation Certificate
- Subdivision works certificate

The Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification Safety) Regulation 2021 and Fire prescribes that applications for Construction Certificates (CCs), Occupation Certificates (OCs) and Subdivision Works Certificates (SWCs) may only be made by a person who is eligible to appoint a principal certifier for the development.

Council cannot accept applications for these Certificates unless the applicant is a person who is eligible to appoint a principal certifier for the development. Therefore, any application for these Certificates must be made by the owner/s of the land upon which the development will be carried out.

When uploading an application for a Certificate to the NSW Planning Portal, the owner/s of the land must be shown on the prescribed form as the applicant/s for the Certificate. The owner can decide if they wish to have the application managed by a third party and provide their contact details as "care of" that third party (i.e. consultant, building firm, contractor, or the like).

COROWA AQUATIC CENTRE SERVICE REVIEW – HAVE YOUR SAY!



The Corowa Aquatic Centre was opened to the public on 26 April 2021 following replacement of the outdoor 50m summer seasonal pool that was decommissioned in 2018 due to safety concerns.

The centre operates year-round and includes a heated indoor 25m three-lane pool with program area, outdoor splash park, outdoor 50m eight lane pool as well as a café, swim shop and changerooms.

The centre has been open for two (2) years and during this time has been under council's direct management. Council initially agreed to run the centre for a minimum 2-year period before considering the longer-term service delivery model. The purpose of this was to provide an opportunity for Council to understand the service as well as having the benefit of 2 years of operational data available.

To assist with maximising the Corowa Aquatic Centre full potential for patrons and the community, Council has undertaken a service review of Corowa Aquatic Centre by an internal working group to identify and weigh-up different service delivery model options that could be successfully implemented at the centre.

The review information was considered at the June 2023 Council meeting and Council will be undertaking community engagement throughout July to seek community input before making a decision about the future service delivery model.

To support this service review, Council will be hosting a series of drop-in sessions with the community to provide them with an overview of the project, and receive feedback as noted above.

Drop-in Sessions will be held at the following locations and times:

- Tuesday, July 18 Corowa Civic Centre – 11am till 2pm.
- Wednesday, July 19 Mulwala Library – 11am till 2pm.
- Tuesday, July 24 Howlong Library
 11am till 2pm.
- Wednesday, July 26 Urana Council Office 11am till 2pm.

Federation Council Mayor, Councillor Pat Bourke encouraged residents to attend the drop-in sessions and engage with Council on the service review of the Corowa Aquatic Centre.

"Council is considering two service delivery methods of the Corowa Aquatic Centre as part of this service review and we are really looking forward to having input from the community," he said.

"Council encourages as many residents and users of this facility to provide their feedback via the online survey, or by writing to Council directly."

Mayor Bourke said through this process, Council was committed to ensuring the facility meets the expectations of our community and patrons, whilst being run as efficiently as possible.

"Our patronage numbers over the last two years since opening prove that this investment in quality infrastructure has been an overwhelming achievement to improve the health and wellbeing of our community," he said.

"The Corowa Aquatic Centre is undoubtedly a drawcard for our region and has made Federation Council an even greater place to live and visit. The Centre welcomes over 400 children weekly to participate in our Learn to Swim Program which has been one of the most successful programs launched to date. Getting the right management model to support the ongoing success and the many benefits this centre provides is of high priority."

URANA CELEBRATES ITS NEWEST HISTORICAL ADDITIONS



Last week dozens of history enthusiasts braved the icy weather and gathered for a day of grand opening events in Urana. The day featured the long-awaited official opening of the Dexter Horizontal Windmill as well as several exciting Urana Progress Association projects, some of which featured Frederick Fox LVO, milliner to the Royal Family and several Hollywood films. A Freddie Fox short documentary, a new book showcasing his hats and the General Store and McCaughey Memorial Hospital interactive displays were launched at the Urana Courthouse Museum.

The events not only gained interest from Urana locals, but drew a crowd from further afield such as Corowa, Wangaratta, Melbourne, Canberra, Hay, Albury and Wagga Wagga.

The day commenced with the windmill opening where attendees heard from speakers such as Karin Coghill, Secretary of Urana Inc., Federation Council Mayor Cr Pat Bourke and the windmill's mechanic, Tim Matt on how the project was made possible by the hard work of many committed individuals. The windmill project was made possible through funding

from the NSW Government's Regional Cultural Fund.

The community came together for a delicious free lunch at the museum which led into the final part of the day's celebrations. The Urana Progress Association launched a glossy book outlining the Frederick Fox LVO story, featuring a curated selection of hats from the 1960s onwards which form part of the Urana Courthouse Museum Collection. Attendees were also treated to the premiere of the Frederick Fox LVO short documentary.

The book and short documentary was compiled with assistance from several staff members of the Museum of Riverina, projects which were made possible with funding from a Tim Fischer AC bequest. Many members of the Fox family were present on the day as well as Tim Fischer's siblings Carol, Vicki and Tony who officially launched the book and video.

The new display attractions of General Store and McCaughey Memorial Hospital and their collections were explored by attendees, proving to be fantastic new additions to the museum which will delight future visitors.

These "buildings" were funded by a Riverina Water Community Grant with containers being supplied by David Nicolls of Rural Container Supplies in Albury. David ensured they came complete with doors, windows, skylights, lining, floors and facade structures. Volunteers added the roof, verandah iron and paint to complete the newest accession in the museum's "outdoor village".

The Dexter Horizontal Windmill can be viewed on Federation Way opposite the Urana Aquatic Centre. Frederick Fox LVO books are available to be purchased from

the Urana Courthouse Museum for \$35. The museum is located at 13 William Street, Urana and is open Tuesday 9.30 am to 3.00 pm and Saturday 10.00 am to 2.00 pm.

FEDERATION COUNCIL RECEIVES SPECIAL RATE VARIATION DETERMINATION



The Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) yesterday (14/06/23) announced determinations on the 17 Councils who had applied for rate variations (increases) above the ordinary allowable rate peg amounts to commence 1 July 2023. IPART has partially approved Federation Council's Special Rate Variation application to temporarily increase its general rate income above the rate peg for a two-year period and not the four-year as applied.

Council has been granted a two-year temporary rate increase of 19% in year one (2023/24) and 17% in year two (2024/25). Council had requested a general rate increase of 19% for 2023/24, with 17%, 14% and 10% for the following three years and for the increases to remain in the rate base, (not be temporary), and reverting to the ordinary rate peg for 2027/28 onwards.

IPART determined the application and only applied the two year temporary

increase due to it considering Council had shortcominas in community awareness factor/criteria. including not communicating the cumulative increase of 74.59%, and only using each years proposed % increase, and also they considered Councils financial documents did not including in the early engagement stages, the impacts of a baseline (non-SRV scenario). successfully met the other criteria including demonstrating the financial need, the increase being a reasonable impact on ratepayers, the quality of Councils Integrated Planning and Reporting documents, and the productivity improvements and cost containment strategies.

The partial approval means Council can increase its rates by 19% and 17% across 2023/24 and 2024/25 respectively should it choose to do so, inclusive of any allowable rate increase (for 23/24 for Federation Council it is 4.3%). 23/24 rate increase will be determined as per normal practice at the June 27 Council meeting. Council needs to re-apply if it wishes for the increases to remain in the rate base ongoing, and if the Council is seeking the further two years of 14% and 10%, or any different amount. Council will likely consider this in the coming months further analysis of the IPART determination and Councils longer-term financial position and further engagement with the community.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said this decision by IPART will allow Council to consider the reasons for the partial approval, and further analysis on the many submissions received by IPART from our community.

MEDIA RELEASE Growing regions open for business

The Albanese Government's new \$600 million Growing Regions Program is now open for expressions of interest.

It provides grants of between \$500,000 and \$15 million to local government entities and not-for-profit organisations, for capital works projects that deliver community and economic infrastructure projects across regional and rural Australia.

The Growing Regions Program stands in stark contrast to the discredited grants programs run by the Liberals and Nationals who ignored guidelines and proper process in favour of pork barrelling the schemes for their own electoral advantage. We have been determined to provide something better for regional Australians. We have spent time working on guidelines that are merit based, transparent and fairer for regional Australians.

The program will invest in critical regional infrastructure and community projects across regional and rural Australia through two \$300 million funding rounds.

The Growing Regions Program is now open for Expressions of Interest which is the first stage of a two stage process to ensure projects meet requirements.

The Albanese Government is a strong supporter of Regional Australia and I encourage regions eligible for the program to take advantage of the opportunity to put in an EOI for eligible projects.

All council areas will be eligible for either the Growing Regions program, or the new Thriving Suburbs program announced in the May budget which will be open later this year. Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
