Bourkey's Brief

It has been another busy month for Federation Council and an exciting one in the grant funding space.

As detailed on the back page of this month's newsletter, Council received 1.1M in grant funding for three projects announced by Member for Albury Greg Aplin.

Excitement continued when a further allocation of funding was allocated to Council, under round two of the Stronger Country Communities Grant program.

Council is set to receive \$3.6 million in round two, with a requirement to spend fifty percent of this allocation on sport and recreation infrastructure.

Council is now calling for expressions of interest from sporting clubs, community groups and organisations who would like their infrastructure projects considered.

Local Councils are the only eligible applicants and must work with their communities to identify suitable projects.

This week council resolved to establish an expression of interest process and I am confident that although we already have a good understanding of community priority projects after calling for applications for the Stronger Communities program last year that this process allows us to ensure we've captured all possibilities.

Groups must submit their expression of interest to council by Monday 9 April, including all the necessary information that will support the preparation of the grant application.

The timeframes are tight and the application process requires projects to be well developed, so this will need to be considered when determining which projects council will submit.

The recent consultation process we've completed to prepare our Community Strategic Plan will also help us to prioritise projects.

Full applications close on Friday 4 May and it is expected that an announcement will be made by the NSW Government in August this year.

In further grant funding news Council has also received funding under the 2017-18 Floodplain Management Program from the NSW Government Office of Environment and Heritage. Nominations are now open to interested community members who wish to join the Federation Council Floodplain Management Committee and I am encouraging all residents in Urana, Boree Creek, Morundah and Rand to consider nominating to assist us in driving this important community project.

Council engages with residents to create shared future vision



Federation Council has completed the second stage of its 'Our Community – Our Opportunity' Community Strategic Plan journey with the successful completion of nine public workshops and two stakeholder meetings across the council area last month.

Over 200 members of the community took advantage of the number of workshops at a variety of locations to engage with Council and share their future vision for Federation Council and its communities.

The Community Strategic Plan (CSP) is the key overarching vision and strategy for the Federation Council Local Government Area (LGA) as a whole. It encompasses civic leadership, social, environmental and economic issues in an integrated manner with input from all key stakeholders.

A range of information was received and recorded by the facilitators from the University of Technology in Sydney and staff from Federation Council, with this data to be presented back to the community in a draft plan in early May.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said Council will be looking to re-engage with the community in May to source further feedback on the draft plan before adoption in June.

"Feedback highlighted many areas of interest and opportunities for the future, some of which will be a Council priority, whilst others may be the priority of other service organisations or government departments, with support or advocacy from Council," he said.

"Councillors and staff embraced the opportunity to meet with members of the community and were pleased to see so many people with a passion for developing the future plan. As Council we received many ideas and insights into the challenges and opportunities facing the future."

Mayor Bourke said the 'Our Community – Our Opportunity' Community Strategic Plan reflects the insight, experience, vision, priorities, challenges and hopes for the future of the Federation Council community.

"The development of the Community Strategic Plan provides us all with the opportunity to participate and share our future vision for Federation Council and its communities," he said.

"I would like to take this opportunity to applaud those community members who have joined us on this journey to ensure we create a powerful vision for our future.

"Council is looking forward to working together with the community in the years ahead to make this vision a reality."

'Drive and Arrive Safely' - a Speeding in Rural Towns Road Safety Campaign



Roads in Federation Council where speeding is an issue are being targeted right now in a major road safety campaign – 'Drive and Arrive Safely'.

The campaign is aimed at slowing down vehicles by increasing driver awareness of the dangers and consequences of speeding and by providing real time advice of the speed vehicles are travelling.

Federation Council's Interim General Manager Adrian Butler said the current campaign is focusing on Kywong-Boree Creek Road, Boree Creek.

"The campaign is targeting this area as speed has been identified as an issue," Mr Butler said.

"Whilst not a high volume of vehicles travel through this area, recent road upgrades can encourage speeding and we are keen to ensure that people travelling through Boree Creek are taking care to drive within the speed limit."

A variable message sign board will be in place shortly on Kywong-Boree Creek Road as part of this project just north of the township. Highway Patrol Police may also be doing random checks in the weeks to come as part of their 'Stop it... Or Cop it' campaign, so speeding motorists are strongly advised to slow down or face heavy fines, including possible loss of licence, when they are caught.

'Drive and Arrive Safely' is a Local Government Road Safety Program project being undertaken by Federation Council in partnership with Local Highway Patrol Police. The project has been developed in response to the alarming figure that 20% of casualty crashes (where someone is killed or injured) in Federation Council in the five years to December 2016 have been speed related.

Grant funding supports Floodplain Management Program

Federation Council has received funding under the 2017-18 Floodplain Management Program from the NSW Government Office of Environment & Heritage.

This grant is for the preparation of floodplain risk management plans for the towns of Urana, Boree Creek, Morundah and Rand.

The project is stage two of the Government Floodplain Management Program and will involve the contracting of specialist consultants who will review the results of the recently completed flood study, undertake a risk management study and prepare draft risk management plans.

Stage one of the program was completed in February 2018, which also involved a community consultation process.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said the Floodplain Management Program will assist the Council to make informed decisions on the land subject to flooding and provides valuable information to emergency services to allow them to develop emergency systems within the area.

"Council is thrilled to receive grant funding from the NSW Government Office of Environment and Heritage to proceed with this important community project," he said.

"Expressions of interest are currently open for community members to join the Federation Council Floodplain Management Committee and Council is encouraging community members to nominate.

"The committee will be meeting quarterly for the duration of the project which is expected to be approximately three years."





Weather permitting the new courts will be constructed by April 2018, followed by court surface painting and minor drainage works.







SEVEN NEW SCHOOL ZONE TRAFFIC OFFENCES



To help schools keep the school zone safer for all pedestrians and drivers there are seven new traffic infringements with new fines.

None of the seven offences attract demerit points when committed elsewhere on the road but in a school zone they each come with two points.

The changes are:

- Stopping in intersection Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- Stop within 20m of intersection (traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- Stop within 10m of intersection (no traffic lights) Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demeritpoints.
- Stop near bicycle crossing lights Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$439 and 2 demerit points.
- Obstruct access to ramp/path/passageway Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a penalty of \$330 and 2 demerit points.
- Not parallel park in the direction of travel Under the changes if a driver commits this offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.
- Parallel park close to dividing line Under the changes if a driver commits this
 offence in a school zone they will receive a \$330 fine and 2 demerit points.

BE ALERT FOR MEASLES

Murrumbidgee Local Health District is asking anyone who was in the Deniliquin CBD on Friday March 9 to be alert to the symptoms of measles after a person who contracted the disease overseas visited the town while still infectious.

Director of Public Health, Tracey Oakman said symptoms of measles include fever, sore eyes and a cough, followed three or four days later by a red, blotchy rash spreading from the head and neck to the rest of the body.

"Measles is highly infectious among people who are not fully immunised and is easily spread through coughing and sneezing by someone who has disease," Mrs Oakman said.

"The measles-mumps-rubella (MMR) vaccine is safe and highly effective protection against measles, and is available for free for those aged one to 51 at your GP. If you are unsure whether you have had two doses, it is guite safe to have another dose.

"The time from exposure to the onset of symptoms is typically about 10 days but can be as long as 18 days so people in Deniliquin should remain alert for symptoms until Monday 2 April 2018.

"Anyone with measles should not to go school, work or go out in public. If you think you might be infected you should see a doctor, but call ahead to make sure you don't infect others at the doctor's surgery," Mrs Oakman said.

Children should receive two doses of vaccine, one at 12 months and the second at 18 months. Anyone born after 1965 should have two doses of vaccine at least four weeks apart. Measles was common before 1966, so most people born before then are immune.

MY HEALTH RECORD

The national expansion of the My Health Record, driven by the Australian Digital Health Agency, will see the My Health Record move to an opt-out model. This means all Australians, unless they choose not to, will have a record by the end of the year.

What is My Health Record?

My Health Record is the new name of the national digital health record system. Having a My Health Record means your import health information such as allergies, medicine details, medical conditions and treatments can be accessed through one system. Healthcare providers like doctors, specialists, hospital staff, pharmacists, and allied health professionals can see it online from anywhere at any time when required — like in an accident or emergency, or as part of your health consultations. Your record is shared securely between individuals and their healthcare providers, and can improve patient outcomes.

What will happen to my existing records?

My Health Record will not replace the existing records at your current health provider, but will allow for more information to be added or accessed, including blood test results, x-ray and other diagnostic reports, pharmaceutical dispense information, hospital discharge summaries and event summaries from specialists and allied health professionals.

Can I get a My Health Record now?

Yes, My Health Record is available now for all Australians. You can register:

In person, visit a Medical Service Centre

Ask you healthcare provider to assist you with registering

What are the clinical benefits of having a My Health Record?

Your My Health Record contains a summary of your key health information. Your healthcare providers keep their own clinical records about the care they provide. When healthcare providers participate in the My Health Record system, they have the option to upload important information about your healthcare to your digital health record. Having this information in your My Health Record will allow other healthcare providers participating to view the information when they provide you with healthcare.

The first step is creating a My Health Record so it can capture your health information over time.







GRANT FUNDING

FEDERATION COUNCIL BENEFITS FROM 1.1M GRANT FUNDING

Federation Council is set to benefit from more than \$1 million in grant funding for three Federation Council projects announced by Member for Albury, Greg Aplin last month.

As part of the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities fund, the funding will go towards three public toilet upgrades across the local government area, the Corowa Cycleway Extension project and a 'limited mobility cabin' accommodation at the Urana Caravan Park.

The Corowa Cycleway Extension project will involve the replacement of a 600m section of an existing, dual use pathway for walkers and cyclists and a 625m extension of the pathway through the Corowa Common and connecting with the Corowa Golf Club. This project will support the delivery of quality community infrastructure that promotes a healthy lifestyle, improves safety and access and strengthens the tourism offering of the area.

The \$100,000 funding for the Urana Caravan Park, which is operated by Federation Council and provides the only major accommodation option for visitors to the Urana Township will now be able to provide limited mobility accommodation for visitors with the installation of a new cabin with a limited mobility access ramp to easily access the cabin accommodation.

\$596,672 will go towards three toilet block projects across the local government area.

This project will ensure that public toilet facilities across the council area meet the needs of residents and visitors, provide disabled access and baby change facilities and promote inclusiveness. With an ageing population that is ten years older than the State median, it is critical that Council ensures toilet blocks are strategically placed and accommodate for all abilities.

This project will further support Council's Playspace Upgrade program, which includes the development of significant play spaces at each of the sites being Bangerang Park, Corowa, Purtle Park, Mulwala and Lowe Square in Howlong.

Council is thankful for this funding, and is confident that the delivery of these projects will only further support Council's goal of building strong and sustainable communities.
