# MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR - PAT BOURKE

Dear Readers, Welcome to the March edition of the Urana District Newsletter.

I would like to begin in thanking the community members who engaged with Council recently in Morundah and Urana by attending our pop up information sessions on the eagerly anticipated new Corowa Aquatic Centre, set to open on

April 26. The meetings also allowed Council to consult and engage, on how a Special Rate Variation works and why Council is pursuing this as an option to help fund the operational costs and ongoing asset life cost of the Corowa Aquatic Centre.

Over the last 12 months, due to COVID, Council has been unable to host face to face community meetings such as this and it is certainly a part of the engagement process that I know Council and the community have really missed. Council is currently working on preparing its 2021-2022 annual budget, and I look forward to further engagement with our residents from across the Council area on a number of projects and initiatives under development, as the year progresses.

The Doctors Road Bridge project is progressing well and it is fantastic to see the new wide two lane modular concrete and steel bridge replacing the old narrow deteriorated timber bridge on Doctors Road, 11 km north of Oaklands.

The old two span bridge built in 1964 to cross Gully Anabranch waterway has truly reached the end of its days with a 5 tonne load limit that has existed for many years.

Focus Engineering are currently installing twenty steel support piles to enable the new bridge to safely carry over 320 tonnes with an estimated design life of 100 years. Read more about this great project, on page eight of this month's newsletter.

As the Easter school holiday period approaches, it is great to see that there are a number of programs being held in Corowa, Urana, Howlong and Mulwala to entertain Council's youngest residents. Bookings are essential, as spots always fill fast, so check out how you can be a part of the school holiday program on page nine of this month's newsletter. Council's Offices will also have altered operational hours over the Easter period. Find out more on this on the back page of this month's newsletter.

### COUNCIL THANKS COMMUNITY POST COROWA AQUATIC ENGAGEMENT SESSIONS

Federation Council has expressed its sincere gratitude to the community members that engaged with Council at the four different community meetings recently.

The community meeting sessions provided residents with the opportunity to engage with Council and better understand the eagerly anticipated new Corowa Aquatic Centre, expected to open in April 2021. The meetings also allowed Council to consult and engage, on how a Special Rate Variation works and why Council is pursuing this as an option to help fund the operational costs and ongoing asset life cost of the Corowa Aquatic Centre.

At an extraordinary meeting on Tuesday, 2 February Federation Council voted unanimously to submit the Corowa Aquatic Centre Special Rate Variation Application to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) for determination.

Based on the extensive feedback, Council Officers recommended that the 2021/22 rate peg of 2% be applied based on the value of land only, and the Special Variation of 6% (\$1.26 per week/\$65.52 per year) if approved, be applied evenly to each property in the Federation Council area.

This results in an increase to average residential rates of \$1.26 per week to go towards the operation costs of the new aquatic facility. If the variation is approved by IPART, average residential rates in Federation will remain in the lowest 20% in the state.

Federation Council General Manager Adrian Butler said he was so pleased to hear the many reports from community members that appreciated the information sessions and had gained a better understanding of what the proposed increase would be used for, and how it would be applied.

"Over the last 12 months, due to COVID, Council has been unable to host face to face community meetings such as this and it is certainly a part of the engagement process that I know Council and the community have really missed," he said.

"Our recent sessions proved so beneficial to all stakeholders, which has allowed the community to gain a greater understanding of where we are at in respect to the new Aquatic Centre and special rate variation journey. There was some concern that the rate variation would apply as a percentage on land value, but Council took into consideration the extensive feedback from the community when surveyed in December 2020 through to January 2021 and made the decision to apply an even fixed increase of \$1.26 per week to every residential household in the Federation Local Government area. This results in a \$65.52 annual increase per year, which would go directly to the operating costs

of the new Corowa Aquatic Centre if approved by IPART."

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said Councillors and Council staff found the sessions invaluable and appreciated the opportunity to meet face to face with residents once again.

"Community engagement has always been a priority of this Council and it was fantastic to be back out across our Council area having conversations with the community about decisions that we are making to improve the livability of our Council area," Mayor Bourke said.

"The community told us what they wanted to see as part of this new facility. and now we're about to deliver on their aspirations by working towards delivering a contemporary regional standard aquatic centre that caters to a variety of needs, and will be enjoyed for many vears to come. Many of the attendees. particularly those outside of the direct Corowa area, made their views clear about the reality that no one likes to pay extra rates, and particularly for some who do not see themselves as future users of the facility. However, on the whole, Council considers the wider community can see the value in the quality of infrastructure projects we are delivering across the Federation region and when equated back to the actual increase, if approved, of \$1.26 per week in this instance, Council considers that this is acceptable for the many benefits this facility will bring."

Mayor Bourke said following the merger in 2016 of the former Corowa and Urana Shires, there had been substantial work undertaken to join both entities together, and deliver on the \$10 million dollars of infrastructure projects, funded by the NSW State Government.

"There was some debate, which normally comes, around about why should I have to pay for a facility that isn't in my town, or one I am going to have travel to," Mayor Bourke said.

"But the reality is we are one community here in Federation Council, and this is something we have worked so hard to highlight since the forced merger. The infrastructure developments that we are seeing created, and those already throughout delivered the wider region will have a benefit to the entire Federation community and ensure that we are a prospering and attractive region from a livability perspective, and as a destination to support our tourism offering. This aquatic centre will be an asset not just for the community today. but one that will meet our communities' needs for the next 50 years or more. I look forward to the day where we can open the doors and see the enjoyment on our residents faces, who are really looking forward to utilizing the new community facility from learn to swim, to aqua aerobics, and general swimming fun in between, all year round."

A decision on the SRV application is expected to be announced by IPART in May 2021.

### CAPITAL WORKS PROJECTS UPDATE

Council has an ongoing program of capital works and upgrades to buildings, parks, playgrounds and roads across the Federation Council Region.

The following activities were undertaken within the month of February 2021 by Federation Council's Works teams:

- Fixing Local Roads Program Shoulder Rehabilitation - Grade shoulders on Merton Road, Bull Plain Road, Savernake Road and Sloan's Siding Road
- Fixing Local Roads Program, Heavy Patching - Izons Road, Balldale-Coreen Road, Oak Lodge Road, Savernake Road.
- Fixing Local Roads Program Vegetation - Commence tree clearance work on Sloan's Siding Road, Mc-Curdie's Road.
- Daysdale S Bends Recommence earthworks for shoulders and batters on new section of Daysdale-Walbundrie Road.
- Corowa Pool Carpark Reconstruction – completion of gravel pavement, primer seal applied ready for asphalt first week of March.
- LRCI Grant Victoria Street and Larmer Street intersection Mulwala, drainage upgrade and footpath realignment.
- LRCI Grant Hume Street, Mulwala
   commence drainage and kerb and gutter upgrade.

- Spring Drive MR314 and MR86 various segments re-sealing – RMS State Roads repair program.
- Rural roads re-seal program Sections of Balldale-Coreen Road, Buraja Road, Rennie Road, Redlands Road.
- Urban Reseal Program Howlong -Emily Court, Townsend Street, Kennedy Street, Hovell Street.
- Flocon Patching Truck: Preparation works for resealing program 20/21 of rural roads and residential street in Howlong as well as repairs.
- Assist Construction crews on Capital Works Projects and shoulder grading with traffic control as required.
- FLR Program vegetation traffic control.
- Urban and rural pothole patching as per Reflect.
- Sundry Gang: FLR Program Traffic Facilities – Regulatory speed sign replacement Corowa Township (other towns to follow), various Customer Requests and footpath repairs.
- Heavy Trucks Support Grader Gangs & Construction Gangs on maintenance - hauling spoil, gravel, and sand.
- Continuation of work on Federation Way at Morundah.

### DOCTORS ROAD BRIDGE WORKS UPDATE



A new wide two lane modular concrete and steel bridge is replacing the old narrow deteriorated timber bridge on Doctors road, 11 km north of Oaklands.

The old two span bridge built in 1964 to cross Gully Anabranch waterway has truly reached the end of its days with a 5 tonne load limit that has existed for many years.

Focus Engineering are currently installing twenty steel support piles to enable the new bridge to safely carry over 320 tonnes with an estimated design life of 100 years.

Currently the large steel piles over 9m long, each weighing over 1.3 tonnes are being driven into the hard soil with a double acting air pneumatic hammer.

The pile driving works are expected to be completed before the end of March 2021.

Doctors Road, Oaklands will be temporarily closed to all traffic for the

replacement of Doctors Road Bridge, 3.7km North of Clear Hills Road intersection from March 1 to May 21, 2021.

The existing narrow single lane deteriorated timber bridge is being replaced with a new wide, two lane concrete and steel modular bridge. The new bridge on the same alignment as the existing bridge will require the temporary closure of Doctors Road to all traffic. Alternative detour via Federation Way is suggested.

This project is being funded equally by Federation Council and the Federal Government's Bridge's Renewal Program.

### **ANZAC DAY URANA**

Council advises that it will be holding a modified Urana Anzac Day service, on Anzac Day, Sunday 25 April 2021, commencing at 10.45 am at the Urana Soldiers Memorial Hall. Please arrive 15 minutes prior, to allow the formal proceedings to commence at 10.45am. Due to COVID-19, Council will not be proceeding with the customary March through the front parking area of the Urana Multi-Purpose Health Service, not the March from McKnight Park Urana to the Urana Soldiers Memorial Hall.

However the other traditional elements of the service, including wreath laying will occur as per normal. Council is at this stage unsure if it has any of the armed forces present for the Catafult Party normally held as part of the service. Thank you for your continued support of the Urana Anzac Day Service.

A belated welcome to 2021 everyone!

Term 1 has begun as busily as ever, with students engaged in hands on activities in the classroom. During science, Years 5 and 6 students are participating in a unit of work titled "Circuits and Switches-Exciting Electricity". ### **URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE**

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.
