NEW REQUIREMENTS FOR NSW FOOD BUSINESSES



Recent changes to the Food Standards Code have introduced new requirements for all businesses that prepare and serve food in NSW. From 8 December 2023, businesses that handle unpackaged food requiring temperature control, and serve it ready-to-eat, must have a qualified Food Safety Supervisor and ensure all food handlers are trained in food safety and hygiene. Higher-risk enterprises must also be able to demonstrate their safe food handling practices. While some businesses already require a Food Safety Supervisor in NSW, the requirement is new for school canteens, childcare services, charities and not-for-profits, correctional centres, delis and supermarkets, and some coffee vendors. Youth across the region enjoyed activities hosted by Federation Council with a STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) flair. The event series was proudly funded by the NSW Government through the Office for Regional Youth Holiday Break Program.

Participants from Corowa, Howlong, Yarrawonga and Mulwala took their creative writing to the next level at the Parallel Wilds workshops held at Yarrawonga Mulwala Golf Club Resort. Creative Director Craig Dent facilitated the group of youth aged 10-16 through the program which captured the imagination of participants and provided a modern and unique platform for storytelling.

The program offered a variety of ways for the youth to get creative, with participants exploring virtual reality technologies, initiating in-depth conversations covering everything from artificial intelligence to varroa mites, to democratically deciding the plots, soundtrack and characters of the group project. Participants also gained a new appreciation for their local environment, identifying and documenting over 40 species of flora and fauna on their bushwalk exploration through

BIOSECURITY WEED CONTROL

With the commencement of Spring and the weather warming up, Biosecurity weeds are likely to become more prominent over the coming months.

Federation Council undertakes a Biosecurity weed inspection and control program throughout the year on Council land and roadsides to reduce the threat to primary production and biodiversity.

Council is currently prioritising the reduction and elimination of Biosecurity weeds, with a focus on problem weeds such as Chilean Needle Grass, St John's Wort, Spiny Burr Grass, Horehound, African Boxthorn, Blackberry, Silver leaf night-shade and Coolatai Grass to name a few.

A spot spraying program will be undertaken from September through to May with the following herbicides being used;

- Glyphosate 360 Bi Active
- Glyphosate 450,540
- Starane Advanced
- BS 1000 Wetter
- Metsulfuron-methy- Brush-off
- Spray Marker Dye- For High volume spot spray areas.

Council is encouraging landowners to take effective measures to remove weeds from their property including spot spraying, biological control and chip and burn. To assist landowners, a range of information and resources regarding weeds can be found at any Council office, which includes printed materials to help with the identification of weeds. A full list of biosecurity weeds, active growth timings and locations can be found on Council's website.

OVERGROWN VEGETATION



Spring is now upon us bringing weather conditions that promote abundant growth of grass, shrubs, weeds and other vegetation. As the fire restriction period is fast approaching, Council is encouraging your help to keep our community safe by ensuring properties are regularly maintained now and into the future.

Federation Council wishes to remind all landowners that they are responsible for keeping the vegetation within their property boundaries, fence lines and nature strips in good order.

Council staff will undertake routine inspections over the coming months and will respond to resident concerns about excessive vegetation growth on properties.

To bring an issue to our attention, please lodge an online customer request from Council's website or contact our customer service team by phone.

Land reported to Council as having overgrown vegetation may be issued with an Order 21 in accordance with Section 124 of the Local Government Act 1993 and may be issued with a Penalty Notice.

COUNCIL ANNOUNCES 2023/2024 COMMUNITY GRANTS RECIPIENTS



The Federation Council's Community Grants Program assists community groups and organisations to deliver events, activities, and programs that enhance the lives of local communities, celebrate important community occasions, and provide opportunities to develop social cohesion and connection in the Federation region.

The Federation Council's Community Grants Program offers two fund rounds per financial year. The total allocation is \$60,000 per annum, with \$30,000 allocated to each funding round. Funding is up to \$3,000.

2023/2024 Community Grants Program - Round One opened on Monday 7 August and closed on Friday 15 September 2023. The recipients represent various disciplines, including community work and welfare, children and families, youth, disability, seniors, health promotion, events and tourism, arts and culture, skill development and training, volunteers, and sport and recreation.

Federation Council congratulates the Round 1, 2023/2024 Community Grant Program recipients, who were announced at the October Ordinary Council meeting:

- \$1,000 cash contribution to the Morundah Bush Entertainment Committee to assist with the cost of hosting the Peter Denehey Concert at Morundah.
- \$327 cash contribution to the Sing Australia - Corowa to support the cost of purchasing new music books.
- \$2,500 cash contribution to the Mulwala Progress Association to support the cost of purchasing lighting & decorations for the Mulwala Christmas tree.

Council will provide a free domestic household hard waste collection service on the following dates:

The maximum amount to be collected from each residence will be limited to one 6'x4' box trailer load.


All items are to be placed on the nature strip in a clear space and should not impede pedestrians.

Council will collect white goods and up to 4 car tyres from each residence. Council will not remove these items if a booking has not been made by contacting Urana's Council Office prior to the nominated dates.

Fibro Sheeting, Greenwaste, Hazardous Materials, Liquids or Asbestos will not be collected.

Residents are requested to place a hard waste material neatly on the nature strip before 8.00am each day.



Be prepared this summer

While summer is the time to get out and enjoy the warmer weather, it also comes with increased risk of fires, storms, floods and heatwaves. Whether we live in cities, suburbs or rural areas, now is the time to prepare so if these events do occur, we can respond quickly and efficiently.

It is important we understand the specific needs and risks for ourselves, our households and our community. It is also important to stay informed, take preventative measures where you can and plan the steps you need to take when an event occurs. This includes getting:

- Fire ready: Make sure you prepare your home by trimming any overhanging trees or branches, mowing overgrown lawn and removing any leaves from gutters or around the house.
- Storm fit: . Check your roof and keep it in good condition, clean gutters, downpipes and drains to prevent blockages, trim trees and overhanging branches, and put away loose items that can blow around in strong winds.

- Flood smart: Start by knowing your local risk and any evacuation plans in place. If you are in a high-risk area have your own emergency plan and emergency kit ready. It's important to consider road and bridge closures and make alterative arrangements for work, children and travel. Never travel through flood water.
- Heat aware: Complete the heatwave preparation checklist to understand if you are more at risk or sensitive to heat and what steps to take during a heatwave. When hot temperatures do arrive, reduce the risk and prepare your home by shutting windows and blinds, using fans or air-conditioning and avoid using the stove or oven.

URANA COMMUNITY RECYCLING CENTRE

Federation Council and the NSW EPA have recently opened two Community Recycling Centres (CRC's) in Corowa and Urana.

Many familiar products you use in your home, car, garage and shed can be hazardous to other people and the environment. Because of this, they cannot be disposed of in your red, yellow or green lidded bins.

These include:

- batteries (household only).
- motor & other oils (5-20 ltrs motor oils and other oils).
- paint.
- smoke detectors.
- fire extinguishers.
- gas bottles.
- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.

The good news is you can dispose of them for FREE at the following CRC's. The products are then processed and the reclaimed materials used to make other products.

The Urana CRC is located at the Urana Waste Disposal Centre, Boree Creek Road, Urana.

The facility is closed Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Years Day, Good Friday and Easter Sunday.
