Completed upgrade on Federation Way gives the community a boost

Works to upgrade sections of Federation Way are fully complete, ahead of time and on budget, providing opportunity for more high-productivity vehicles to use this important freight route.

The \$1.65 million road upgrade involved the reconstruction, realignment and widening of 4.5 kilometres of Federation Way between Urana and Morundah and reconstruction of culverts to bring the section of road up to the same standard as adjoining sections.

Removing tight corners, increased signage, line marking centre and edge lines (to be completed soon) and reducing dust all contribute towards road safety, particularly for heavy vehicles.

Federation Council Administrator Mike Eden congratulated Council staff on completing the project over 12 months in advance of scheduled time.

"The completion of this project is a credit to the wonderful work delivered daily by our staff who are

well advanced with preparation for the 2017/18 Capital Works Program," Mr Eden said.

"At Federation Council we understand through community consultation, the overwhelming community view is that maintenance of sealed and unsealed roads should be a top priority for Council.

"The Draft Delivery Program and Operation Plan currently on public exhibition, proposes to invest unprecedented funding towards Council roads.

"More than 70% of Council's total capital works budget for 2017/18 will be spent on roads and this will exceed \$10M of investment, with a further \$3.8M of Stronger Communities Grant funding allocated to roads over the next two financial years."

Member for Albury Greg Aplin said that he was proud the NSW Government contributed \$800,000 to the important Federation Way project through the Restart NSW Fixing Country Roads program and the Federation Council's work saw this project completed over 12 months in advance of the scheduled timeframe.

"The Fixing Country Roads program provides targeted funding to local councils for road projects that will eliminate connectivity constraints on local roads in NSW and reduce the cost to market for local businesses," Mr Aplin said.

"Projects such as the Federation Way upgrade create economic benefits for industry, by removing pinch points and reducing constraints on the transport of goods across NSW and interstate."

Mr Aplin said that the work on Federation Way will provide improved access for grain freight to the GrainCorp Primary Export Site at Oaklands and for livestock to the Urana and Corowa saleyards.

"This project provides benefits for local industry and for the broader community," Mr Aplin said.

"A more viable freight link will cut extra costs for producers while a safer, smoother road for cars and buses benefits residents.

"I applaud Federation Council for delivering this important community project in an effective and efficient manner."

The Federation Way upgrade also received \$800,000 in funding from the Australian Government's Heavy Vehicle Safety and Productivity program and \$50,000 from Federation Council.

Council launches Play Space Upgrade Program



Federation Council is placing a strong focus on improving the liveability of the area, as it works to meet the needs of residents, support youth and attract young families.

An unprecedented level of funding is being directed towards addressing what have been important community priorities for many years.

Local families and visitors will benefit from a number of initiatives across the council area that are designed to improve access to recreational facilities and create inclusive and welcoming community spaces.

Federation Council Administrator Mike Eden said the Play Space Upgrade Program is a key priority for council, with a number of projects expected to be completed by the end of the year.

"This is a really exciting time for our communities," Mr Eden said.

"These are projects that residents have been asking for or working towards themselves for a long time.

"The Stronger Communities Funding has provided a once off opportunity for an injection of funds into community infrastructure, but many of the projects are also being made possible thanks to community fundraising, business support and long term savings from council."

Mr Eden said the partnerships between council and the community, which are driving many of these projects, is what he finds most pleasing because it demonstrates what can be achieved when we work together.

The Play Space Upgrade Program now has its own logo which will be used to create a strong awareness of the various projects.

Residents will be kept up to date as progress is made, with regular updates available from council's website.

"We are encouraging people to follow and really celebrate these projects, because there is a significant benefit to the wider community from what is being achieved here," Mr Eden said.

"In addition to providing activities for local families and young people to enjoy, the new and redeveloped play spaces are expected to drive visitation and promote the area as a family friendly destination.

"We are continually building on what the region has to offer and hope to see this reflected in the long term growth and sustainability of the Federation Council area."

The playground at RSL Park in Corowa will be one of the first projects completed, along with a new playground at Memorial Park in Howlong.

Design of the Corowa Skatepark redevelopment has been finalised and consultation will soon commence with young people in Howlong about the concept plans for the street terrain style skate park to be constructed at Lowe Square.

Council Compliance Notifications for Companion Animals

Whether you consider yourself a dog person or a cat person, we all have a responsibility to our companion animals. Council works hard to communicate with local pet owners regarding these responsibilities, keeping both our fury friends and our community safe.

Responsibilities of Pet Owners

- If your dog is in a public place it must be under the effective control of a competent person by means of an adequate chain, cord or leash. The exceptions to this are; dogs exhibited at a show or engaging in obedience or agility trials or a dog secured in a cage or vehicle or in an approved off leash area.
- If your dog is being exercised in an approved off -leash area it must always be under effective control of a competent person.
- You are not permitted to walk more than four dogs at any one time in an on-leash or off-leash area.
- Greyhounds must be muzzled at all times when in a public place.
- If your dog defecates in a public place it is an offence not to remove the faeces.
- Dogs are prohibited in children's play areas, food preparation/consumption areas, reception areas, public bathing areas, school grounds, childcare centres, shopping areas and wildlife protection areas.

Microchipping and Registration

Microchipping and registration is a two-part process that requires dog and cat owners to:

- Have their dog or cat implanted with a microchip from the time they are 12 weeks of age, at point of sale or change of ownership (whichever occurs first).
- Register their animals with their NSW local council by 6 months of age.

Both the microchipping and registration of your dog or cat include a one-off fee and are for the life of the animal.

Stand for Your Community – Call for Council Election Nominations

Federation Council Administrator Mike Eden is encouraging more people - including women, young people and people from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds - to stand for their community at this year's September Local Government elections.

Mr Eden believes a greater representation of candidates from all walks of life would not only strengthen Federation Council, but also ensure it has a greater voice for all ratepayers.

"Councillors have an important role to play in making decisions that respond to the changing needs of the community," Mr Eden said.

"Serving the local community as an elected councillor is a challenging but rewarding role.

"It doesn't matter if you don't think you have the experience in local government – if you are passionate about your local community and want to make a real difference then I encourage you to consider this opportunity and stand for your community."

Federation Council has a population of over 12,000, of which over 70% of these are eligible voters. Anyone who is eligible to vote at Council elections in NSW is also eligible to stand for election as a councillor.

Prospective nominees should firstly check to ensure they are on the electoral roll for Federation Council by contacting the NSW Electoral Commission.

"Our council should be a reflection of the people and communities they serve," Mr Eden said.

"Bringing diverse views and experiences to decision making will ensure our local communities get the best solutions and outcomes."

Any questions regarding tip items should be directed to the landfill site manger.


Please ensure to cover trailers en route to tip, and to bag loose papers to prevent the creation of wind borne litter.
