COUNCIL REFINES SERVICE DELIVERY



As of Wednesday 24 March, Federation Council has announced it will be refining its service delivery to ensure the safety and wellbeing of its staff and communities as the coronavirus pandemic continues.

Council will be closing its offices, depots and a number of other facilities to the public, and is encouraging its residents to go online, via its website, email or phone to do their Council business for the foreseeable future.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said that Council recognizes it was time to protect its critical service delivery for the betterment of Council's communities and therefore refine the way in which Council delivers its services at this point in time.

"Council, like all authorities and our community, is taking the COVID-19 pandemic very seriously and receiving continuance guidance and instructions from our Federal and State authorities, and implementing new business practices in response," he said.

"In the wake of tighter public health restrictions, there are implications that will touch every member of our community in some way. You only need to look at the stringent measures that have been put in place in the UK, the USA and other nations to understand what is likely to occur if we do not strictly follow the instructions around social distancing, personal hygiene and not congregating in large groups."

Mayor Bourke said the best health advice is that social distancing is the most effective tool available to combat the spread of COVID-19 in our community.

"We must all do as much as we can to help combat the risks of COVID-19 taking hold in our Community, and right across Australia, it is clearly the biggest threat to face us all in modern times" he said.

"Council is continuing to act on its Business Continuity Framework, with senior management, and supporting staff meeting regularly to assess and implement various new practices to support our community during this time."

FEELING UNWELL?

The most common Coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms reported include:

- Fever;
- Breathing difficulties;
- Cough
- Sore throat; and
- Fatigue/tiredness

One way to help control the spread of the disease is to practice good hygiene habits:

- Always washing hands with soap and water before eating and after visiting the toilet (minimum 20 seconds)
- Covering your nose and mouth when coughing and sneezing, and disposing of used tissues immediately;
- Avoiding close contact with anyone with cold or flu-like symptoms; and
- Seeing a health care professional if you are unwell, and staying away from your workplace and other public places.

COUNCIL CLOSES CARAVAN PARKS - LATEST GOVERNMENT ADVICE

With the Coronavirus (COVID-19) situation evolving daily, Council's focus remains on keeping our community safe and informed as quickly as possible.

In line with Government restrictions and in the interest of public safety, Council wishes to inform the community, valued guests and other stakeholders, that Ball Park Caravan Park and Urana Caravan Park will be closed to the public for the foreseeable future.

The NSW Minister for Health and Medical Research has directed that the following must not be open to members of the public;

Caravan parks and camping grounds, except for purposes of -

- Accommodating permanent residents of the caravan park or camping ground or other persons who have no other place of permanent residence, and
- Allowing visitors to visit persons.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said new measures to be brought in place will ensure public safety measures could continue to be met in a reactive environment.

"Closure of our caravan parks will help protect the health and safety of our caravan park guests, the wider community, as well as our park operations staff," Mayor Bourke said.

"The Federal and State governments, as well as supporting lead agencies have been very clear that all Australians should cancel their Easter break plans and stay close to home. The nature of the shared facilities in our parks, like toilets and showers, is a significant concern in the current circumstances."

Mayor Bourke said the health of the community and its staff, remain Council's number one priority and minimising the spread of corona virus is imperative.

"Council will continue to maintain both parks to ensure they can be utilised for emergency management only for the foreseeable future."

People who have sites booked will receive a refund for unused sites and are encouraged to contact each respective park for further information. Management request that guests of the park who need to begin the process of a refund, to please email the park to assist staff who are experiencing a high volume of calls during this period.

COUNCIL BEGINS 'OUR COMMUNITY MOVEMENT' IN LIGHT OF CORONAVIRUS



In the midst of the global novel coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, where uncertainty can strike at the core of our everyday lives, Federation Council is encouraging all residents to look out for their neighbours - particularly those who are most vulnerable - and show that community spirit and resilience for which our Federation residents are renowned for.

This week, Council will begin an online digital campaign on its corporate Facebook page and website that will deliver weekly tips and messages of encouragement to Federation Council residents to help combat social isolation, loneliness and community disconnection.

Like many acts of kindness starting to emerge online by other councils and organisations, Council officers have developed a free postcard that can be downloaded from our website. Residents can print out the postcard and pop it in their neighbour's mailbox using good hand hygiene or screenshot and send to their neighbours electronically.

Anyone is welcome to use this and Council urges residents, businesses, community organisations and other councils to share it with their communities. Participants are also encouraged to share their community spirit on social media by using the hashtag #ourcommunitymovement

The 'Our Community Movement' campaign encourages people to get to know their fellow neighbours and assist those who may be isolated or cannot get out and travel around or having difficulties coping, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said Federation Council was well-known for its community spirit and resilient 'can do' attitude and called on all residents to get on board.

"What we're asking people to do is please reach out and check on your neighbours, especially our older neighbours," Mayor Bourke said.

"It could be something as simple as leaving one of these postcards in your neighbour's mailbox and offering to purchase a few groceries for them if they're

in social isolation, helping to put their bins out or even just writing down your phone number so they have someone to call if they need to have a chat. This also gives people a chance to connect in ways we might not have considered and result in lifelong friendships."

Mayor Bourke said there is no doubt the Covid-19 pandemic will continue to impact the way we all live our lives, how we move about in our community, how we work and how we interact with one another.

"It is fair to say that no community will be left unscathed from this event – and the predictions are it will prevail for at least the next six months," he said.

"What is important is that we come together as a community, support each other, look out for each other, show kindness and consideration. Now more than ever, we must look out for the most

vulnerable in our community and think locally in every decision we make.

Council understands our community look to us as local leaders in times like this and we know we have an important role to play in this pandemic and that is being the conduit between leading agencies, and ensuring our community is reassured of its strength and determined nature in times such as these."

FIREWOOD COLLECTION PERMITS



Residents in the Federation Council area can apply to obtain a permit to collect firewood from road reserves for home heating during winter.

Firewood collection is limited to 1 April – 30 September each year.

To apply for a permit, residents must complete the application form and show proof that they reside in the Federation Council area (i.e. drivers licence). Applicants must certify on the application that they will abide by the permit conditions and acknowledge that Council is not liable for any injuries to person, or any loss or damage to property arising from the firewood collection activities.

Residents will need to apply for a permit each firewood season (each year).

The permit application fee is \$30.00.

ARTS & CULTURAL SURVEY




Federation Council is committed to creating a vibrant arts and cultural environment for our residents and visitors.

- Family violence; and
- Other factors resulting in unforeseen changes in a property owner's capacity to meet their payment obligations.

WHAT IS SAFE TO FLUSH DOWN YOUR TOILET

Following recent toilet paper shortages, our staff have seen an increase in wipes and other items being disposed of down the toilet.

A reminder to residents that paper towel, tissues, newspaper and wet wipes even if they are marked 'flushable' should not be disposed of in your toilet. Disposing of these items in your toilet can cause sewer pipe blockages which can lead to sewage overflows into homes. Toilet paper is the only item that is safe to flush down your toilet.

ROAD VIDEO SURVEY

The road survey vehicle has two cameras configured to capture images every 20m along the road. A roof mounted 360 view camera (like google street view) and a forward facing camera to capture a closeup view of the road surface.

This imagery will assist Council with operational decisions for road sealing, pavement repairs and asset management along with State government funding programs.


COROWA DISTRICT LANDCARE DROUGHT SUPPORT

In 2019, the Federation Council Region was identified as drought affected by the NSW Department of Primary Industries and was subsequently invited to apply for \$1 million in funding from the Federal Governments Drought Communities Extension Program.

Part of this funding saw the appointment of a Drought Support Officer with Corowa District Landcare for a period of approximately six months. The support officer's role is to act as a referral point for farmers across the Local Government Area, ensuring access to key support programs and initiatives.

In early 2020. Corowa District Landcare (CDL) appointed Peter Craze to the new role. Part of Peter's role is to develop a strong understanding of drought conditions in an effort to drive and shape policy decisions on behalf of Federation Council. The position will also liaise with key State and Federal Government agencies regarding drought related programs and initiatives and assist in the liaison and coordination of funded drought projects.

Peter is also working with the Corowa District Landcare Local Landcare Coordinator, to provide drought information, and sourcing external funding opportunities for local community groups and farmers of the Federation Region.



Corowa District Landacare was also successful, as part of the Drought Communities Extension Program to deliver a series of workshops to land managers in the Federation Region, covering topics and issues including: livestock management, ground cover, soil health, grazing management, increasing production, new technologies, improved planning, labour allocation and prioritisation.

Corowa District Landcare supports and works closely with Federation Council, landholders, community members and key stakeholder groups who are engaging in natural resource management and sustainable agricultural activities.

Now that the students are not physically at school it will be more difficult to interact, but won't there be some wonderful stories when we all get together again!!!



OUR HERITAGE

MUD HUT REPAIRS - COREEN VALE SCHOOL

In remote locations there were many provisional (temporary) schools built by parents. Parents would build a school house from wood, tin or earth. They could then petition the Education Department to fund a part time or full time teacher.

Coreen Vale was one of these remote. temporary schools. Kids either rode horses to school or walked. The schools were called "provisional" because they operated on and off, depending on fluctuating student numbers. This was an eventful time for students as well as parents. Parents built this tiny mud brick school in 1932 during the peak of the Great Depression, when Australia's unemployment reached 32%. The school closed in 1944, shortly before the end of the Second World War. Some former students are still alive. They and their relatives actively protect the school house.

The building had already been noted by 1940 to be in very dilapidated condition. Lately however, the building was further threatened by roof water erosion, termite damage and severe structural cracking.

To save this small heritage listed hut, family descendants (including former student, Roley Nixon) organised a working bee, assisted by heritage worker Mimi. The volunteer group was well organised and came well prepared. They brought excavation machinery to dig additional soil, a cement mixer, generator, water tanks, wheelbarrows, shovels, food and refreshments. Mimi brought plastering

tools and demonstrated their use to the group. On the first day the eleven workers repaired major cracks with earth plaster. On the Second day they re-plastered the crumbling earth walls to stabilise them. Volunteers said it was a tiring, but ultimately very satisfying, experience.

Former student, Roley Nixon, recalled how the students, all boys, would all be climbing trees and have to be coaxed down by the female teacher. He recalled how on one occasion the teacher chased Roley around the schoolhouse to punish him for a misdemeanor. He ducked back into class, to watch her still circling the schoolhouse.

On behalf of descendants, Janet Lake said, "Thanks to Federation Council and to Mimi herself for unfailing good humour and professional instruction on how to mud plaster; we learnt a lot, repaired the schoolhouse and all thoroughly enjoyed the experience."
