TIM FISCHER COMMUNITY PARK

Federation Council has re-named the Boree Creek Community Park in honour of former Deputy Prime Minister, Tim Fischer AC, who hails from Boree Creek.

On Sunday 21 July, a special event occurred, to honour this service to his country, and for never forgetting Boree Creek, where it all began for Tim, and a place he feels very much where his heart is.

Around 80 locals and 200 train passengers on board a classic 47 Diesel Locomotive called the Riverina Spirit, who had travelled from Albury on the train with Tim, all joined in to surprise Tim with this announcement, and tounveil a special sign to signify the park's new name.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Patrick Bourke said Council endorsed at its July Meeting to re-name the Park to the Tim Fischer Community Park, in honour of Mr Fischer, and planned this event in conjunction with the Boree Creek Community Committee and Phil and Jenny Baker from the Boree Creek Hotel.

"The community of Boree Creek and surrounds warmly welcomed Tim and

passengers where a ceremony was held and the park name and sign was unveiled. The decision to re-name the park was first raised by Boree Creek residents and supported by Federation Council".

"It was fantastic to see a passenger train visit Boree Creek. The last time this occurred was many years ago." "I'd also like to thank and acknowledge the support of Stuart Patey, Chair of the Boree Creek Community Committee, and Jenny and Phil Baker from the Boree Creek Hotel. The Hotel did a terrific job also in the catering on the day, and it was great to see such a crowd in town, with Tim and his family amongst the crowd," he said.

Tim responded after the event and said "I was completely taken by surprise by the kind decision of locals in consultation and liaison with Federation Council to launch the Tim Fischer Community Park. The ceremony was brilliantly timed and all went really well, indeed the packed special train passengers were delighted to observe and they made it back safely to Albury and on time.

I would ask Council to accept my sincere thanks and I would add the Community Park is in really good shape and looking very nice, albeit another burst of rain would help the town park and district.

The Boree Creek Community Committee do a wonderful job.

Can I especially commend the sign and the blue colour of the sign, really great work by all directly involved. I hope in a round about way the renaming will help draw more visitors to Boree Creek, especially in Autumn and Spring. Again my sincere and heartfelt thanks, for myself but also on behalf of Judy and my family".

In addition to the sign, Council with community support will also be commissioning a plaque that outlines just some of Tim's service and accomplishments, so that visitors in years to come will all be able to stop and understand and learn more about Tim Fischer, and the reason why this park is known as Tim Fischer Park. There could also be some more public art initiatives in the future, so watch this space.

Mr Fischer grew up in Boree Creek where he later farmed in between his long and distinguished career, including service in the Vietnam War.



RIVERINA WATER COMMUNITY GRANTS

Riverina Water has launched a \$500,000 community grants program to support a wide range of projects and activities that enhance life in the Riverina Water supply area. This includes parts of the Federation Council area such as Oaklands, Rand, Urana, Boree Creek, Colombo Creek and Morundah.

Three grant categories are available including Community Projects and Facilities, Arts and Culture and Water Conservation with grants from \$1000 to \$20,000 depending on the category.

BIOSECURITY WEEDS

With the commencement of Spring and the weather warming up, Biosecurity weeds around Federation Council area are likely to become more prominent over the coming months. This is particularly so given rainfall of late, creating ideal conditions for weeds to grow.

Council is currently prioritising the reduction and elimination of Biosecurity weeds, with a focus on problem weeds such as Chilean Needle Grass, St John's Wort, Spiny Burr Grass, Horehound, African Boxthorn, Blackberry, Silver Leaf Nightshade and Coolatai Grass.

An inspection program is undertaken by Council throughout the year to manage Biosecurity weeds in the area and to minimise the spread of these weeds. This inspection programassiststoidentifyweedsintheir early growth stage, so that Council and landowners can control the spread of weeds. Council is encouraging landowners to take effective measures to remove weeds from their property.



There is also a phone available to access phone self-service or speak to a Department service officer.



WHERE IS THE CLOSEST DEFIBRILLATOR?

Over 33,000 people experience an out of hospital cardiac arrest in Australia every year. Less than 9% will survive. Often it is up to bystanders quickly to find the nearest defibrillator.

A defibrillator (sometimes called a 'defib', or AED if it's an automated external defibrillator) can save someone's life if they have a cardiac arrest. They are easy to use and take up no more room than a fire extinguisher.

Ambulances have them on board, but using an AED in the minutes before an ambulance arrives can double someone's chances of survival. In fact, research has shown that early cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and defibrillation in the first eight to ten minutes sees survival rates jump from 6% up to 75%.

Federation Council's Ageing Well Advisory Committee are compiling a register of public access defibrillators so people in the community know where they are located if needed in an emergency.

Businesses, community groups and individuals are being encouraged to let us know where publicly accessible automated external defibrillators



BOREE CREEK FREIGHT LINK ROAD CONSTRUCTION

Federation Council has commenced construction of the 3.1km Boree Creek freight link road.

This major project includes bulk earthworks, excavation, import of fill for compacting and stabilization works.

The project is on time and scheduled to be completed during late November, weather permitting.

LOCAL HEALTH ADVISORY COMMITTEE "SERVING THE LOCAL COMMUNITY"

Local Health Advisory Committee's "LHAC" are a committee of volunteers that were instigated a few years ago under Murrumbidgee Local Health to serve local hospitals and the community and advise MLHD of community needs. Their beginnings go much further back than that however. The first evidence of "health care "being in 1875 with the first doctor arriving in Urana. The first hospital being founded in Urana in 1881. These became the Hospital Board, then when the current MPS was constructed, the MPS Committee and now the LHAC. Thanks to Denis Smith one of our committee members who is gathering together some of the history of our local health service. We hope to bring you more snippets of the past in future updates.

Urana has a very dedicated group of 7 people on their committee from a variety of backgrounds. We meet once a month at the Urana Community Centre. We are here to support and work with the local MPS and facility manager, Community Health, local Doctor and most importantly the community.

- Do you need help or advice with an issue concerning a local health issue? Not sure who to turn to?
- Do you have an idea to help add services to our area? A way to fill a gap in a particular area?

Your local LHAC can try and help point you in the right direction or bring your issue to the attention of the right person or department.

The Urana MPS serves an area that basically covers what used to be the old Urana Shire. Thanks to Federation Council, the good news is that the medical clinic in Oaklands is on track to be opened this year, which will be a huge plus for the area. Watch this space and Council notices for an opening date.


