COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM ROUND TWO 2019-2020 OPEN



Round two of the Federation Council 2019-2020 Community Grants Program is to open Monday 9 March 2020, with funds available to help local community groups, organisations and clubs to deliver a range of community projects and events.

Council Mayor Pat Bourke is encouraging not-for-profit groups and organisations to apply for a share in \$60,000 of funding for this year's second round of Community Grants Program.

"The Community Grants Program is an initiative aiming to empower groups to develop ideas, projects and events that can contribute to the vibrancy and connected community of Federation Council," Mayor Bourke said.

"We see this as a way to bring forward new ideas and help to develop existing projects to a new height. The grants program is a community focused initiative that gives Federation organisations a way of involving the wider community, their participation in local activities and, championing projects that have a strong economic and social impact."

Eligible applicants can apply under one of three categories:

- Category 1 Seed funding grant; to support the establishment of new initiatives, applicable up to \$3,000 per applicant.
- Category 2 Emerging Grant funding; to support the promotion of emerging projects, applicable up to \$1,500 available per applicant.
- Category 3 Community Events Grant; to support the strategic development for small to medium events, applicable up to \$1,500 per applicant.

"If you are an eligible group and you have a great idea that can benefit the wider community, submit your initiative through the Community Grants Program via our online form by Monday, 6 April."

Council encourages all groups wishing to apply to check Council's corporate website for the upcoming tutorial on how to fill out the new and simplified online application form, as well as the updated guidelines to ensure Council can assist as many groups as possible bring new ideas to fruition for the region.

The Community Grants Program will continue to operate in two funding rounds each year, in October and April. Applications close Friday, 10 April at 4pm. Applications recommended for approval will be considered and announced to successful groups at the May Ordinary Council meeting.

PEDESTRIAN ACCESS MOBILITY PLAN (PAMP)



The Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan (PAMP) consultations closed late 2019 and Council is now in the process of undertaking the next stages which include:

- Prioritisation of suggested treatments (these come from both the afore-mentioned consultations and outstanding items from previous PAMP).
- Update Maps (to show both existing and proposed Pedestrian Infrastructure).
- Draft Plan design and layout.

The Draft Plan will then be presented to Council for endorsement and from there to community for comment and further input which we estimate to occur in May 2020.

From the consultations, 81 locations have been identified across the Council area as requiring treatments. In addition there are 61 outstanding actions from the previous PAMP.

Council looks forward to providing a further update when the draft plan is available for review and feedback.

MURRUMBIDGEE LOCAL HEALTH DISTRICT (MLHD) 2020 COMMUNITY SURVEY

Federation Council is encouraging residents to complete the MLHD 2020 Community Survey.

The 2020 Community Survey gathers information from people across the Murrumbidgee region about their experience with and knowledge of services in hospitals and other healthcare facilities.

Murrumbidgee Local Health District working with Local Health Advisory Committees manages the survey program. The survey is anonymous. Participation in the survey is voluntary and respondents cannot be identified from the information provided in this survey.

The purpose of the 2020 Murrumbidgee Local Health District Community Survey is to:

- Measure consumers level of awareness about services offered
- Identify gaps in the provision of information

WATER CONSERVATION MEASURES



Riverina Water is urging the community to be vigilant and conserve water where possible as the scorching summer weather continues.

During the daylight savings period, sprinklers and irrigation systems are not to be used from 10am to 5pm. This is a permanent water conservation measure, which is followed by water restrictions if daily water usage reaches certain trigger points.

The region is extremely fortunate in that access is provided to safe and reliable drinking water through dams and groundwater, however, it does not mean we are immune to the ongoing drought and hot conditions.

Federation Council is encouraging residents to adhere to the permanent water conservation measure and do not use sprinklers or irrigation systems from 10am to 5pm.

You can also lodge forms online, get your identity documents certified and pick up brochures.

DROUGHT: WE ARE WITH YOU



If you are a farmer, farm worker or farm supplier/contractor who is doing it tough because of the drought you may be entitled to receive a one-off payment of \$3,000 funded by the Australian Government's Drought Community Support Initiative Round 2 (DCSI). You need to be over 18 years of age, be an Australian citizen or permanent resident, and live or work in an eligible Local Government Area (LGA).

EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PROCEDURES



Council is aware that some community members are seeking information about the process that Council will follow if an emergency event was to occur in our region.

Whilst it is important that we assist and support our community, in an emergency event, a coordinated response is led by the relevant emergency agencies such as the Rural Fire Service, State Emergency Service and Police.

In the event of a bushfire or emergency event, Council's role is to provide support and resources and take direction through an Incident Control Centre led by the relevant control agency (i.e. Rural Fire Service, State Emergency Service or Police). If required, the Incident Control Centre determines when and where relief and / or evacuation centres are established. Once this happens, a multi-agency effort will swing into action and appropriate resources deployed.

We want to take this opportunity to thank the volunteers who have been fighting the bushfires and our community for its support and generosity over this time.

MURRUMBIDGEE YOUTH COMMUNITY GRANTS

FEDERATION VILLAGES FLOOD PLANNING

Since our last update, WMAwater have been progressing the elements of the Federation Villages flood planning that rely on hydraulic assessment and analysis, and are compiling findings into the Stage 2 reports for submission in the new year. These reports cover a range of topics for each town, including but not limited to:

- Assessment of hydraulic hazard and hydraulic categorisation;
- Assessment of flood damages and identification of properties affected (and frequency of over-floor flooding);
- Preliminary development of Flood Planning Areas (mainstream and overland);
- Preliminary identification of properties eligible for Voluntary Purchase or Voluntary House Raising; and
- Preliminary assessment of structural flood mitigation measures (AKA 'Flood Modification Measures').

With our preliminary technical assessments nearly complete, we look forward to getting input from the committee and Council staff to develop these items further, and ultimately arrive at a set of recommendations for each village.

A brief summary of the flood modification options assessed is provided below:

Boree Creek

 Options generally focus on improving conveyance of flow from upstream ofthe railway to downstream. Options include bridge expansion, channel augmentation, culvert upgrades and

- installation of new culverts.
- The investigation showed that significant structural works to the railway embankment and channel would be needed to make a material difference to flood risk in Boree Creek.
- The feasibility of gaining approval to modify the embankment however could pose a major challenge to these options.

Morundah

- Investigation of current level of protection of the Morundah levee, and if further works are required to the north;
- Assessment of additional levee pipes to improve internal drainage;
- Range of culvert upgrade options for local roads;
- Excavation of a drainage channel from Back Morundah Road through to Colombo Creek;
- Diversion bank behind properties on Milvain Drive (0.6m above the ground); and
- Diversion bank behind properties on Milvain Drive in conjunction with pipe upgrades through the levee.

Oaklands

A range of options to improve the overland flow path through the Oaklands Recreation Reserve were modelled. The preferred option currently involves excavation of a new swale drain and bunding around the half of the northern field. Bunding could be designed for use as spectator seating. This option would substantially reduce the extent and duration of inundation within the

- Recreation Reserve, allowing sporting fixtures to resume much sooner following rain events;
- Additional options were assessed regarding the local stormwater drainage through Milthorpe Street, which was noted a few times during community consultation. However, it is difficult to assess the effectiveness of these options as the hydrologic model has been set up to simulate larger overland flow events, rather than local stormwater runoff/ drainage.

Rand

- Extension of the levee at the northern end of town; and
- Range of road modifications in conjunction with culvert upgrade on Walbundrie Road to reduce flood risk to motorists

Urana

- A range of levee alignments have been tested for Urana (to offer a 1% AEP level of protection). It is noted that internal drainage is a key consideration in the design of any levee option to ensure overland flow can reach the creek (if the creek water level is low enough) without impacting properties inside the levee;
- Stormwater drainage systems and culvert upgrade options have been assessed to manage local flooding of specific roads;

A range of options to utilise the Aquatic Centre to mitigate flood risk have been assessed, including water varvina initial levels simulate drawing the dam down before an event), modifying the outlet structure and constructing a secondary spillway at the southwest and increasing the dam's capacity. At this stage the analysis shows that the available storage volume is not sufficient to reduce flood risk in Urana (due to the sheer scale of flooding), however there could be benefits in drawing the dam down ahead of local rain events. This option will need further assessment as the project progresses.

COROWA SALEYARDS UPGRADE TO OCCUR

At its January ordinary meeting, Federation Council awarded a tender to Corowa based firm, Focus Engineering for \$431,926 to complete upgrade works to the Corowa Saleyards.

The Corowa Saleyards is owned and managed by Council and has been operating for more than sixty years. The facility is well respected and utilized by industry professionals across several states throughout Australia.

Council programs major maintenance to the saleyards, once every five years and tender works awarded were identified for the 2019/2020 financial year and will ensure improved compliance with Work, Health and Safety requirements, animal welfare and increase holding capacity.

Project upgrades include:

- Construct and install auctioneers walkways overhead and independent of existing selling pens; and
- Construct and install 29 new selling pens.

Federation Council Mayor Pat Bourke said the saleyard facility has experienced consistent market growth over the last twenty years, at a time when the industry has faced a number of challenges including the impact of long-term drought.

"Recent upgrades to the facility, access and transport linkage improvements and strong management has ensured the Corowa Saleyards is one of the most highly regarded and utilised livestock facilities in the state," Mayor Bourke said.

"Currently, the Corowa Saleyards is recognised as one of the four largest saleyard facilities in New South Wales and in order to future proof the operation, appropriate innovative planning in and around sustainability and growth must be pertinent to any future strategic decisions. Council looks forward with anticipation to witnessing this upgrade and further strategic upgrades planned for the site come to fruition."





MEDIA RELEASE URANA IMPROVES PALLATIVE CARE EXPERIENCE

Patients, families and carers will soon benefit from reburbishments to the Urana MultiPurpose Service (MPS) palliative care unit, thanks to a \$200,000 boost from the NSW Government.

Urana MPS will have their Palliative Care rooms upgraded. The rooms will include a kitchenette, ensuite, new floor covering, paint and soft furnishing.

Murrumbidgee Local Health District Chief Executive Jill Ludford said the refurbishments at Urana MPS will help bring some comfort to people at the end of life.

"We are really pleased to be upgrading our specialist palliative care services so that we can offer care as close to home as possible," said Ms Ludford. "Families play such a pivotal role during end-of-life for palliative patients so it's important that the space encourages loved ones to stay and take part in care and wellbeing."

The Urana MPS is one of 34 palliative care facilities across the state that will be refurbished over the next two years, with planning underway for additional projects from 2021.

This follows the NSW Government's commitment in 2019 of \$10 million for palliative care facility refurbishments, as part of a \$45 million enhancement over four years for palliative care, announced



in the 2019-20 NSW budget.

Dr Nigel Lyons, Deputy Secretary, Health System Strategy and Planning, NSW Health, said the refurbishments to more than 34 palliative care facilities across the state will make a real difference to the experiences patients have in hospital at the end of life.

"Ensuring that our patients, their families and carers receive quality palliative care in a safe, comfortable and home-like environment is a priority for NSW Health," Dr Lyons said.

This funding is part of the \$10.1 billion the NSW Government is investing in health infrastructure over the next four years to upgrade and build 29 hospital and health facilities.

The NSW Government's 2019-20 Budget commitment also includes recruitment of 100 new palliative care nurses, more Aboriginal Health Workers, and support for digital health to improve access to palliative care. This is in addition to the \$100 million palliative care package announced in the 2017-18 Budget.

Please Note: MLHD Specialist Palliative Care service is a district wide service and while we have staff located in the media release, we ensure that all communities have access to specialist services.

OUR HERITAGE HISTORIC MONUMENTS AT URANA

HISTORIC MONUMENTS AT URANA CEMETERY

Urana Cemetery was built on a sand hill where it was easy to dig graves. But the windswept location and shifting sand has caused some historic monuments to lean and then collapse. Monuments that had smashed were in a critical state of disintegration and were too heavy to lift by hand.

So Council's heritage adviser Peter Kabaila was delighted when Federation Shire depot staff Sam and Paul agreed to help. Paul Fields brought the backhoe and some materials from Urana depot. Mimi the heritage worker had reassembled some smashed monuments ready for lifting back into the ground.

With great care, the monuments were stabilized by lifting vertically into the ground with new footings. Instead of being lost to the community, these historic monuments will now last for many more years.

We would like to acknowledge Urana Depot Manager Mark Falcone for allowing Paul Fields and the depot's backhoe to help in the restorations!

- fluro lights.

Once you no longer have a use for these products, they become household problem waste. If disposed of incorrectly, or released into the environment, these products can pollute our soil, contaminate our water and even cause physical harm to people and animals.
