COUNCIL ADOPTS OPERATIONAL PLAN, DELIVERY PROGRAM & FINANCIAL PLAN



Federation Council has adopted its 2019/2020 Operational Plan, 2018 - 2021 Delivery Program and Financial Plan at it's ordinary June Council Meeting.

Council facilitated a series of community information sessions throughout the region whilst the plans were on exhibition, to present the documents in draft form, after Council endorsed them at its May meeting.

Federation Council Mayor, Cr Pat Bourke thanked those residents who attended the information sessions, or provided feedback throughout the consultation and exhibition period, which ran from 23 May to 20 June.

"We really appreciate that people have taken the time to talk to Council," said the Mayor. In total, we received

feedback from 54 people and groups. We have considered each issue or concern raised and where possible, the plans have been adjusted to reflect the feedback received." Most of the feedback received by Council during the consultation period related to issues that could be addressed within existing plans and are already being progressed, whilst others that require further consideration will be worked on and communication will occur to advise of this.

This will be the fourth year of Federation Council, and it will see Council continue to work with many local community members and organisations, as well as the State and Federal Governments as funding partners in many projects. 2019/20 will see some significant community projects being delivered right across the Federation Council area, with some of the bigger ticket items, and their estimated budgets, shown below:

- Corowa Swimming Pool Complex, \$9.5 million.
- Howlong Multipurpose Hall \$1.6
 million.
- Urana Aquatic Leisure Centre Building \$935,000.
- All Abilities Playground at Purtle Park Mulwala, \$809,000.
- Bangerang Park Corowa -Playground upgrades and renewal works, \$650,000.

- Oaklands Medical Centre, \$614,000 (Purchase & renovations).
- Corowa Skate Park extension and part renewal works, \$453,000.
- Lonsdale Reserve Mulwala, Bay 13 Building upgrades and continuing with Master-plan works - \$200,000.

"The operating budget will provide resources to continue the wide range of services that our communities expect, including maintaining roads and bridges, collecting and disposing of waste, and providing water and sewerage services to our homes. It also supports many varied committees including the Federation Youth Council, Arts and Culture Committee, and the many Section 355 Committees, as well as continuing the annual \$60,000 Community Grants Program, and providing a fantastic mobile preschool service, and vibrant libraries." Mayor Bourke said.

In addition to significant community infrastructure projects to be delivered, Council is also set to focus on delivering a \$37 million capital works program that includes:

- \$12.9 million in further road improvements
- \$3.3 million for the Corowa-Mulwala Cycling and Walking Trail.
- \$1.5 million for development of land at the Howlong Industrial

Estate.

- \$500,000 for improvements to the Corowa Saleyards.
- \$25,000 to commence implementation of the recently adopted Ageing Well Strategy.
- \$150,000 to conduct urgent rectification works at the Ball Park Caravan Park.
- \$140,000 into flood plain risk management at Daysdale.
- \$185,000 contribution towards the Mulwala, Howlong and Corowa Flood Study.

Mayor Bourke said "A balanced operating budget has been developed to ensure that we live within our means, and Council is extremely cognisant of the very tough seasons that affect so many of our ratepayers, directly and indirectly, and have applied the allowable increase of 2.7% evenly across all rate categories. Council is satisfied that it has worked hard to ensure an even spread of funding occurs across all of our many communities that will continue to see plenty of projects delivered and our services maintained and strengthened where possible."

Council will provide regular reports to the community in relation to the implementation progress of the plans. Residents are being encouraged to view the final documents which are available for download from Council's website.

RATE NOTICES

Council wishes to advise that rates have been levied for the 2019/20 financial year. Notices will be issued mid July 2019 with the first instalment due 31 August 2019.

Water bills are in the process of being read and bills will be issued during the middle of July. Payment for water bills are expected to be mid to late August 2019.

Section 355 Committees

Councillor delegates are appointed annually to Section 355 committees and appointments are communicated to each committee in writing.

Councillors play a key role in that they are primarily responsible for:

- providing advise to the Committee on Council policies that may affect it and ensure that it is complying with its Constitution, especially with regard to its powers and financial activities;
- assisting the Committee to lobby Council; and
- reporting to Council on the activities of your Committee.

If your Committee has something that it would like Council to provide or change (e.g., more funding or other assistance or a change to its Constitution or a request to fundraise), then your Committee should write to Council's General Manager making its request. Your Councillor may well support your request in the Council meeting if it is discussed, but it is not his/her responsibility to initiate that request to Council.

Where a Councillor is appointed to represent Council on your Committee, he/she has the full rights of a member of your Committee, including voting rights and must declare any conflict of interest at each meeting. All conflicts of interest must be minuted.

Councillors may hold an executive position but should not be the Chair except in exceptional circumstances.

Note: Each Councillor, whether a member of a committee or not, is entitled to attend and speak at a meeting of a Council committee. However, only Councillors who are members of the committee are entitled to put business on the committee's agenda, move or second a motion at the committee meeting, or vote at the meeting.
